

SPIRITUAL AMBUSH



“Even if my fig trees do not blossom and my vines grow no grapes, if my olive crop fails and my fields produce no harvest, and even if all my sheep die and I’m left with no cattle in my barn, I still have Yahweh, and I will rejoice in him. Yes, I will dance with joy no matter what, for I have a Savior-God!” Habakkuk 3:17-18 TPT

Joy is the fruit of the recreated human spirit that every believer has. However, joy must be stirred, it is not the product of happiness or nice things happening to us. Like the Prophet Habakkuk, we must stir up joy from within us regardless of what is going on in our lives.

It’s evident from the Scripture above that nothing was working; everything had failed. Yet Habakkuk found reason to dance with joy. Are you a Christian? Are things going south for you? There is an answer for your situation and it is the joy of the Lord in your spirit. You must choose to activate the power of joy through laughter, singing or dancing.

See how God responds to those who plot against Him in the book of Psalm 2:2-4 (NLT): ***“The kings of the earth prepare for battle; the rulers plot together against the Lord and against his anointed one. “Let us break their chains,” they cry, “and free ourselves from slavery to God.” But the one who rules in heaven laughs. The Lord scoffs at them.”***

Maybe you are aware of a person or group of people plotting against you, don't be moved, every time the issues come to your mind, respond by laughing just like your Father did.

Joy is a spiritual ambush for the enemies of your destiny, employ it always to thwart demonic attacks and harassment in your life. Glory to God forever.

CONFESSION

NO SIDE EFFECTS



“A joyful, cheerful heart brings healing to both body and soul. But the one whose heart is crushed struggles with sickness and depression.” Proverbs 17:22 TPT

All human medicine has negative side effects, and in the long run, can become detrimental to the health of a person who continues to consume it. But the joy of the Lord, according to our opening Scripture, is medicine, with no harmful side effects whatsoever.

This joy isn't a result of nice things happening to you; it's what the Holy Spirit produces in our born-again spirits. It's an internal state that you must activate or turn on. As Galatians 5:22 (AMP) says, ***“The fruit of the [Holy] Spirit [the work which His presence within accomplishes] is love, joy (gladness), peace, patience (an even temper, forbearance), kindness, goodness (benevolence), faithfulness.”***

Joy's healing power extends beyond the physical body to the soul. As a child of God, the Bible offers solutions to every situation you will ever encounter. To enjoy your inheritance in Christ, be a doer of the Word.

Proverbs 15:13 (MSG): ***“A cheerful heart brings a smile to your face; a sad heart makes it hard to get through the day.”*** Choose joy in your walk, no matter what. Who knows how much money laughing, singing, and dancing will save you? This wisdom of the Spirit gives us advantage over Satan, his

demons, and the world.

Surprisingly, this teaching may not be taken seriously by some, who would rather visit doctors or go to healing meetings for prayers. Purpose to be different. Walk in joy daily and watch your health blossom!

This is what Apostle John prayed for believers in his day: ***“Be-loved friend, I pray that you are prospering in every way and that you continually enjoy good health, just as your soul is prospering”*** (3 John 1:2 TPT). Achieving divine health requires intentional effort. A significant part of this, according to God’s Word, is maintaining a cheerful and joyful heart, regardless of external circumstances. Praise God.

CONFESSION

I activate joy by the Spirit and walk daily in strength, health, and vitality. Sickness and depression have no place in me, for I enjoy continual prosperity and good health. Glory to God, Halleluyah!

SATURDAY, 3RD

FORTIFY YOUR BODY BY JOY



“A cheerful disposition is good for your health; gloom and doom leave you bone-tired.”
Proverbs 17:22 MSG

A seasoned military general would not wait for an attack to commence before constructing fortifications or building a castle for defence. Instead, they would proactively build these structures in anticipation of any potential threats. This strategic approach stems from their extensive training, which enables them to envision and prepare for future invasions.

The Word of God shows us that there’s an enemy moving around like a roaring lion looking for prey to devour. ***“Be well balanced (temperate, sober of mind), be vigilant and cautious at all times; for that enemy of yours, the devil, roams around like a lion roaring [in fierce hunger], seeking someone to seize upon and devour”*** (1 Peter 5:8 AMPC).

As a Christian, it’s important to understand that there will be an attack from the enemy one day. To prepare for this, we must build strongholds. Our theme Scripture teaches us that a cheerful disposition is one way to build strongholds for the health of our bodies.

“Take a decisive stand against him and resist his every attack with strong, vigorous faith. For you know that your believing brothers and sisters around the world are

experiencing the same kinds of troubles you endure” (1 Peter 5:9 TPT)

Be intentional and take a decisive stand against the devil by laughing, singing songs of praise to the Lord, and dancing.

When we laugh, we express the joy that’s inside our spirit. Laughter is a divine strategy to ward off enemies. It fortifies the body against sicknesses and diseases. This year, laugh every day, even if it doesn’t make sense. Many times, it won’t, but just laugh.

PRAYER

Precious Father, I thank You for the joy of the Lord that fortifies my body and strengthens my spirit. I choose joy daily through praise and laughter, resisting every attack of the enemy. My health is preserved, my strength renewed, and my life secured by divine joy, in Jesus’ Name. Amen.

SUNDAY, 4TH

THE LORD REJOICES OVER YOU



“Adonai your God is right there with you, as a mighty savior. He will rejoice over you and be glad, he will be silent in his love, he will shout over you with joy.” Zephaniah 3:17 CJB

Knowledge of something makes us aware of it. For instance, if someone deposits five thousand dollars into your account, and the bank doesn't alert you, you can't spend it because you're unaware of its availability. However, once you know the money is in your account, you become conscious of it and can then use it.

The Word of God primarily informs us about our spiritual account, allowing us to spend from it as we would the five thousand dollars. Our opening Scripture focuses on God's delight and pleasure in us, His people.

Understand that God delights in you as an individual, not as a group. He rejoices and praises you in heaven. Picture God shouting and bursting into joy in heaven! The Word of God tells us this. He sings a song of praise for you, not for Himself. The Passion version expresses it thus: ***“Yahweh, your God, is inside you. He is the Warrior-Savior who takes such delight in you that it will make him leap for joy and shout with great gladness. Yes, he will soothe you with his love. He will sing over you his song of praise”*** (Zephaniah 3:17 TPT).

In the New Testament, the Word lets us know that He lives in us. In the Old Testament, He was among them but not inside them. If He could rejoice over them with singing, protect and defend them, how much more should we expect? There is absolutely nobody, no witchcraft and no force from hell that can ever break through His shield of protection to hurt us. Glory to His Name forever.

PRAYER

Heavenly Father, thank You for Your love and presence in my life. I am grateful that You rejoice over me, delight in me, and protect me. Help me to live in Your joy, trust Your guidance, and walk confidently in Your love and blessings. In Jesus' Name, Amen.

MONDAY, 5TH

YOU ARE HIS SIGNET RING



“And on that day”—this is God’s Message—“I will take you, O Zerubbabel son of Shealtiel, as my personal servant and I will set you as a signet ring, the sign of my sovereign presence and authority. I’ve looked over the field and chosen you for this work.” The Message of God-of-the-Angel-Armies.” Haggai 2:23 MSG

The Christian is someone in whom the Lord has invested so much! I would to God that His children realized who they are, what they have, and what they can do. When the Lord Jesus ascended into heaven, He did not give the responsibility of making disciples to the angels but to us. Just think about the significance of that!

Not only that, He gave us the power of attorney to legally represent Him and execute Kingdom business on His behalf. This was the essence of a signet ring in those days. Once a document was sealed with a signet ring, it became legal and could not be changed.

A signet ring symbolises authority, ownership, and legal representation. Rulers used them to seal documents with their unique stamp. For instance, Pharaoh of Egypt gave one to Joseph (Genesis 41:42) as a mark of delegated power.

In Esther 3:10-12, Haman conspired against the Jews and convinced the King to certify his writings, making them a law that even the King couldn’t alter. Another instance occurred in

Daniel 6:12, when the King sealed the conspiracy of Daniel's haters with his signet ring. He couldn't change it, even though he wanted to, because it had become a law.

Do you know that our theme Scripture was a prophecy about us Christians? Look at the opening verse from AMPC: *“..... says the Lord, and will make you [through the Messiah, your descendant] My signet ring; for I have chosen you [as the one with whom to renew My covenant to David's line], says the Lord of hosts.”* [2 Sam. 7:12, 16] (Haggai 2:23 AMPC).

We are the ones who came forth as a result of the work of the Messiah, Zerubbabel's descendant. In confirmation of that prophecy, Jesus gave us all power in heaven and earth before His ascension (Matthew 28:18-19). We are authorised to live and operate in His place as His signet ring. Halleluyah!

Just as the signet ring seal of a King made laws which could not be changed, so it is with us today. What we seal becomes a law in the spirit realm. We have seen different scenarios documented in Scripture where kings were not in agreement with what was written but couldn't change it because it had the seal of their signet ring. You and I, are now the King's signet ring. Whatever we speak is a law in the spirit realm. We must be mindful of this. If we speak words that contradict the Word of God, we will bear the consequences (Proverbs 18:21).

CONFESSION

I am God's chosen signet ring. I carry His authority, represent His Kingdom, and whatever I decree in alignment with His Word is established in the spirit realm. I am empowered to execute His will on earth as it is in heaven. I walk in divine authority, purpose, and favor, and nothing can nullify the law of God that I release.

TUESDAY, 6TH

THE EXPRESSION OF JOY - THE WINNING WAY



“As the days on which the Jews got rest from their enemies, and as the month which was turned for them from sorrow to gladness and from mourning into a holiday—that they should make them days of feasting and gladness, days of sending choice portions to one another and gifts to the poor.” Esther 9:22 AMPC

Often, God’s children don’t realise the powerful secret of expressing joy as a divine strategy for winning spiritual battles. Observe the opening verse: the month was turned for them from sorrow to gladness and from mourning into a holiday – that they should make them days of feasting and gladness. In case you are not familiar with the story, those days were appointed for death and doom for all the Jews in the kingdom of Persia.

Expressing joy releases divine strength in your spirit. For instance, the Jews under Nehemiah’s leadership were going through a distressing time because they had disobeyed the Lord. Jerusalem was in ruins, and they were praying, crying, and mourning. However, the Word of the Lord came to Nehemiah in Nehemiah 8:10 (MSG): He continued, **“Go home and prepare a feast, holiday food and drink; and share it with those who don’t have anything. This day is holy to God.” Don’t feel bad. The joy of God is your strength!**”

Notice three things in this verse: 1) stop crying and go home,

2) prepare a feast or holiday food and drink, and 3) share it with those who don't have anything. These are all expressions of joy. As a Christian, you must respond correctly to difficult situations by expressing joy in these ways. Joy is already in your spirit; unleash it through laughter, giving to others and having a feast. During the feast, make it a point to sing and dance in the Spirit. Do this and see things turn around for your good.

“May the thought of this cause you to jump for joy, even though lately you’ve had to put up with the grief of many trials. But these only reveal the sterling core of your faith, which is far more valuable than gold that perishes, for even gold is refined by fire. Your authentic faith will result in even more praise, glory, and honor when Jesus the Anointed One is revealed. You love him passionately although you have not seen him, but through believing in him you are saturated with an ecstatic joy, indescribably sublime and immersed in glory” (1 Peter 1:6-8 TPT).

We weren't promised no persecution or trials, but we were given guarantees of victory through the expression of joy. James by the Spirit tells us to count it all joy when we face challenges. Joy, not tears, is the Spirit's mind regarding our response to trials and difficulties. Bless God.

CONFESSION

I choose joy as my strength and my weapon. I turn sorrow into gladness and trials into triumph. I express my joy through laughter, celebration, giving, and praise, and in doing so, I release divine power that shifts every situation in my favor. The joy of the Lord is my source of victory, and I walk daily in unstoppable gladness. Halleluyah!

WEDNESDAY, 7TH

TRY JOY



“For you shall go out [from the spiritual exile caused by sin and evil into the homeland] with joy and be led forth [by your Leader, the Lord Himself, and His word] with peace; the mountains and the hills shall break forth before you into singing, and all the trees of the field shall clap their hands.” Isaiah 55:12 AMPC

In medicine, prescriptions are changed if a particular medication isn't working. If the diagnosis is inaccurate or a low-grade medicine isn't effective, the doctor will stop and change it. Maybe you thought prayer would bring the desired change to your situation but there hasn't been any improvement. Have you tried joy?

Isaiah the Prophet saw in a vision God's people coming out of spiritual exile with joy. This means prayer alone wasn't enough to produce the results they desired. This prophecy is for us today. Don't disregard or underestimate the impact of joy on your spirit, soul and body. This entire month, purpose to engage in the various expressions of joy as discussed in yesterday's article for your divine release. Glory to Jesus.

And you know what? God's majesty, power, and presence are released when joy is expressed. All the trees, representing multitudes of people, will clap their hands, symbolising testimonies and celebrations. Why don't you try joy, my brothers and sisters?

The Apostles understood the supernatural power of joy in the midst of persecution, trials and sufferings. Paul the Apostle said, ***“Be cheerful with joyous celebration in every season of life. Let your joy overflow!”*** (Philippians 4:4 TPT). In every season of your life and not just when you get a promotion, find a spouse, receive a new job or are feeling healthy and strong. Joy is the winning code. Punch it in the spirit realm and promotion, marriage, a new job and all your heart’s desires will be granted. Halleluyah!

PRAYER

I am filled with joy in every season of life. My joy releases God’s power, shifts circumstances, and brings divine breakthroughs. I rejoice continually, knowing that my celebration aligns me with God’s presence, peace, and victory. Halleluyah!



THURSDAY, 8TH

JOY, NOT OUTSIDE FORCE

“But the fruit produced by the Holy Spirit within you is divine love in all its varied expressions: joy that overflows, peace that subdues, patience that endures, kindness in action, a life full of virtue, faith that prevails, gentleness of heart, and strength of spirit. Never set the law above these qualities, for they are meant to be limitless.” Galatians 5:22-23 TPT

There’s a big difference between happiness or fun and joy. Like we have mentioned before, joy is a state or character of the spirit of a born-again child of God. It’s an inside force that makes a person laugh, sing, dance, or express themselves cheerfully. Unlike happiness or fun, joy is not automatic; it requires you to activate it. If you don’t activate joy, it won’t be expressed and experienced.

There are three conditions for unleashing the joy in your spirit:

1. A teaching Church – Unless you are in the right Church where you are being fed with right doctrine, you cannot express or experience the joy of the LORD.

“When your words came, I ate them; they were my joy and my heart’s delight, for I bear your name, O LORD God Almighty” (Jeremiah 15:16 NIV).

2. The company you keep – Regardless of the Church you belong to, if you keep the wrong company, they will rob you of the joy of the LORD. Remember, evil company corrupts good morals.

“So stop fooling yourselves! Evil companions will corrupt good morals and character” (1 Corinthians 15:33 TPT).

3. You must decide to live a life of joy all your life. “My dear friends, you always obeyed what you were taught. Just as you obeyed when I was with you, it is even more important for you to obey now that I am not there. So you must continue to live in a way that gives meaning to your salvation. Do this with fear and respect for God” (Philippians 2:12 ERV). Joyous living is living in a way that gives meaning to your salvation. Halleluyah!

Instead of waiting for something to make you laugh, practice laughing daily. Meditate on the Word of God daily and surround yourself with faith people who aren’t offended by your joyful expression. Glory.

PRAYER

Heavenly Father, thank You for the gift of Your Spirit and the fruit of joy You’ve placed within me. Lord, I choose to activate the joy in my spirit today, independent of circumstances or external forces. Let my heart laugh, sing, and dance in Your presence, and may Your joy be my unshakable strength in every season. In Jesus’ Name, Amen.

FRIDAY, 9TH

BEGIN YOUR DAY WITH JOY



“when the stars of the morning sang together and all the angels shouted for joy.” Job 38:7 FBV

The morning hour is a season in life when men set new orders and patterns, especially if the past was unpleasant. If the past was wonderful, you get to set in order something that is even greater in glory and dimension. A crucial aspect of this is starting your day with a shout of joy.

Do you know that even the animals and birds understand that the morning time heralds a new beginning and season? The birds sing, announcing the arrival of a new day, and God’s voice is heard in their songs. God is announcing that you can start afresh, set a new tone for your life, and command your day with a shout of joy.

Look at what Psalms 30:4-5 says in the Message: ***“All you saints! Sing your hearts out to God! Thank him to his face! He gets angry sometimes, but over the course of a lifetime, there’s only love. The nights of crying your eyes out give way to days of laughter.”*** Don’t let your sorrow or sadness continue into a new day. Terminate it with a joyful shout and enjoy a victorious life. Halleluyah!

The Lord has given us the tongue of the learned. Isaiah 50:4 (NKJV) says,

“The Lord God has given Me The tongue of the learned, That I should know how to speak A word in season to him who is weary. He awakens Me morning by morning, He awakens My ear To hear as the learned.” The tongue of the learned is one that has been trained to shout with joy and triumph. The wisdom of the righteous teaches a man’s tongue to sing and shout joyously in the morning, setting the momentum of victory for their day and life. Blessed be God.

CONFESSION

I begin each day with joy and triumph. My tongue sings praises, my heart overflows with gladness, and I set a victorious tone for my life. The past does not define me; every morning is a new beginning filled with God’s love, favor, and blessings.

COUPLE JOY WITH THANKSGIVING



“Out of them will be heard the joyous songs of thanksgiving and the raucous shouts of joy. I will cause them to flourish and not diminish. I will bring them honor, and they will not be humiliated.” Jeremiah 30:19 TPT

When you study the Scriptures, you’ll notice that joy and thanksgiving are like twins. The theme verse highlights joyous songs of thanksgiving and raucous shouts of joy flowing from God’s people. Genuinely thanking God requires a heart full of joy.

“Let them offer sacrifices of thanksgiving and sing joyfully about his glorious acts” (Psalm 107:22 NLT).

The state of gratitude is a product of a heart or tongue of the learned. Joy creates an atmosphere that makes it easy for us to be grateful to God for what He has done for us. People who are always sad and complaining are never appreciative. Observe if you haven’t been keen enough; the most joyful people around you are full of gratitude, they are grateful to God and they are grateful to people.

“So two good things will result from this ministry of giving: the needs of the believers in Jerusalem will be met, and they will joyfully express their thanks to God” (2 Corinthians 9:12 NLT).

Again, the Scripture shows us that believers in Jerusalem would joyfully express their thanks to God. When we thank God without joy, it doesn’t hold much spiritual significance. Therefore, cultivate and practice a joyful lifestyle in order for

your thanksgiving to be truly meaningful.

Remember, when you were born into the world as a baby, you learned how to live the human life. It's the same with the new creation. When you receive Christ, you must learn the spiritual life and live according to God's Word. Halleluyah!

CONFESSION

Because He dwells in you, your life is never empty or ordinary. The Holy Spirit sanctifies your thoughts, words, and actions from the inside. He influences your desires and aligns your heart with God’s will daily.

The indwelling Spirit fosters fellowship. Christianity is not practised from a distance but lived in communion. God walks with you because He resides within you. This awareness engenders reverence, confidence, and intimacy with God.

Living conscious of the Spirit within transforms how you carry yourself. You begin to honor God with your body, choices, and lifestyle because you know He dwells in you. The indwelling Spirit makes holy living both possible and natural. Hallelujah!

This transformation is progressive, it’s not a one-day thing. The Scripture says we move from glory to glory. The Holy Spirit patiently works in you, shaping your attitudes, renewing your desires, and aligning your conduct with the Word of God.

The inner workings of the Holy Spirit are clearly evident in the production of the fruit of the Spirit. As Galatians 5:22–23 (NLT) states, **“But the Holy Spirit produces this kind of fruit in our lives: love, joy, peace, patience, kindness, goodness, faithfulness, gentleness, and self-control. There is no law against these things!”** This fruit is evidence of the Spirit’s work, not human discipline.

Transformation brings growth and stability to your life, producing consistency. As a believer, you begin to respond like Christ in pressure, conflict, and temptation. This transformation reshapes your reactions and motivations from the inside out.

As your character undergoes transformation, God entrusts you with increased authority and responsibility. God confides in transformed vessels. By yielding daily to the Holy Spirit, you accelerate your maturation and accurately reflect Christ to the world.

CONFESSION

I yield myself to the Holy Spirit. My character is being transformed into the image of Christ. The fruit of the Spirit is evident in my life daily. I reflect God's glory in my thoughts, words, and actions. I grow from glory to glory by the Spirit of the Lord.

The teaching ministry of the Spirit reveals truths beyond human intellect. As stated in 1 Corinthians 2:12 (NLT), **“We have received God’s Spirit (not the world’s spirit), so we can know the wonderful things God has freely given us.”** This knowledge instills confidence and accuracy in spiritual matters.

The Holy Spirit brings remembrance, allowing truths learned to be recalled at the right moment, such as during prayer, ministry, decisions, or challenges. Nothing taught by God is ever wasted.

The Holy Spirit teaches us in three main ways. Firstly, through your spiritual leaders. According to Jeremiah 3:15, God anoints pastors and teachers to train His children in righteousness. Secondly, He teaches you as you fellowship with Him in

prayer and the Word. By yielding yourself to His leadership, you learn many things, including what is specifically related to your vocation. Thirdly, through books written by anointed men and women of God. Daniel 9:2 tells us that Prophet Daniel understood the prophetic period of Israel's captivity by reading the writings of Jeremiah the Prophet.

When the Spirit teaches, confusion leaves, direction becomes clear, and spiritual errors are avoided. The believer who listens inwardly walks in wisdom and divine alignment.

CONFESSION

I am taught by the Holy Spirit. I receive wisdom, revelation, and understanding daily. My spirit is open, sensitive, and responsive to His instruction. I walk in truth, clarity, and divine accuracy. The Spirit of God leads me into all truth.

The Lord Holy Spirit is like the game guide – He knows everything about everything. As the Bible says, **“For what man knows the things of a man except the spirit of the man which is in him? Even so, no one knows the things of God except the Spirit of God”** (1 Corinthians 2:11 NKJV). Just as you must listen to the game guide if you are to successfully make it through the game park, you likewise must follow the Holy Spirit’s guidance in order to be prosperous and have good success.

Let us say you’re considering a marriage proposal from three different gentlemen and you’ve expressed your desire for His guidance. You must yield to Him and wait patiently upon Him to help you identify the right person. Take time praying in the spirit and you will discern the His guidance. Sadly, many people in such situations seek instead the counsel of their friends.

Psalm 43:3 (KJV) says, **“O send out thy light and thy truth: let them lead me; let them bring me unto thy holy hill, and to thy tabernacles.”** The Spirit leads by truth, and not physical signs, what feels good to you or the approval of your friends and family.

The Holy Spirit speaks and guides in agreement with God’s word. As John 16:13 (AMPC) states, **“He will not speak His own message [on His own authority], but He will tell whatever He hears [from the Father].”** Every instruction from the Spirit is accurate and perfectly aligned with God’s will. Guidance into truth requires sensitivity and submission. Isaiah 30:21 (NLT): Your own ears will hear him. Right behind you a voice will say, **“This is the way you should go,”** whether to the right or to the left. The Spirit often guides inwardly, quietly, and persistently. Those who cultivate fellowship with Him recognize His voice clearly and follow Him confidently.

PRAYER



Our opening Scripture reveals something remarkable about the ministry of the Holy Spirit in our lives. When He comes, we receive power. This power is from the Greek word *dunamis*, which means miracle-working ability, the inherent power to cause change, or the power that resides in a thing by virtue of its nature.

This divine power transforms a Christian into a miracle worker by enabling them to function at the frequency of Almighty God. They become proof producers, witnessing for Christ in their Jerusalem or hometown and beyond. This empowering force propels them onto a global stage, not through emotional excitement, but through the divine ability to live, stand, and represent Christ effectively. Without the Spirit, spiritual living becomes frustrating and inconsistent.

This empowerment, as expressed in Ephesians 3:16 (NLT), ***“I pray that from his glorious, unlimited resources he will empower you with inner strength through his Spirit,”*** strengthens you from within. The Spirit fortifies your inner man, enabling you to endure pressure and remain steadfast in faith. This strength, derived from the Spirit, provides stability during times of trial.

The Spirit's power enables victory over sin. Romans 8:13 (TPT) declares, ***"If by the power of the Holy Spirit you put to death the deeds of your sinful nature, you will live."*** Victory is not achieved through self-effort but through divine empowerment. As the Spirit works, sinful habits lose their grip, and righteousness becomes natural. 2 Timothy 1:7 (KJV) says, ***"For God hath not given us the spirit of fear; but of power, and of love, and of a sound mind."*** The Spirit removes fear and supplies boldness, enabling you to speak, minister, and stand for truth without intimidation.

When strengthened by the Spirit, your life radiates the glory of God. Micah 3:8 (NKJV) proclaims, ***"But truly I am full of power by the Spirit of the Lord."*** This power transforms your life into a living testament to divine authority, boldness, and unwavering consistency.

CONFESSION

I am empowered by the Holy Spirit. Divine strength works in my inner man daily. I walk in victory, boldness, and authority. Fear has no dominion over my life. I live and serve by the power of God.

FRIDAY, 16TH

“Likewise the Spirit also helpeth our infirmities: for we know not what we should pray for as we ought: but the Spirit itself maketh intercession for us with groanings which cannot be uttered.”
Romans 8:26 KJV

The word ‘weakness’ in the verse above does not just refer to physical weakness; it encompasses all human limitations involved in prayer. The context tells us that we don’t know what we should pray for as we ought. Prayer isn’t just about praying anyhow; you need to know what to pray for as you ought. Only the Lord Holy Spirit can supply that knowledge.

There are prayers where you don’t have the right utterances to communicate what’s in your spirit. When words are insufficient, the Holy Spirit intervenes. Romans 8:26 (NLT) says, **“The Holy Spirit prays for us with groanings that cannot be expressed in words.”** This ensures that even when you lack the words to express what is in your heart, prayer remains effective and aligned with God’s will.

It is not possible to pray for two hours without the help of the Spirit. The Spirit’s assistance brings strength where human ability fails. Isaiah 40:29 (AMPC) states, **“He gives power to the faint and weary, and to him who has no might He increases strength [causing it to multiply and making it to abound].”** The LORD supplies strength through the Spirit.

Grace manifests the divine work of the Holy Spirit in times of weakness. The Lord told the Apostle Paul in 2 Corinthians 12:9 (NLT), ***“My grace is all you need. My power works best in weakness.”*** The Holy Spirit channels grace into areas of limitation, transforming insufficiency into spiritual advantage. What once hindered you becomes a platform for God’s power.

A Christian who relies on the Spirit walks in rest and assurance. Hebrews 4:16 (KJV) declares, ***“Let us therefore come boldly unto the throne of grace, that we may obtain mercy, and find grace to help in time of need.”*** The Spirit helps continually, ensuring the believer is never abandoned to inadequacy and disadvantage.

PRAYER

Holy Spirit, I acknowledge my need for You. Help me in every area of weakness and limitation. Strengthen my prayer life and daily walk. I receive grace and divine assistance right now. Thank You for carrying me by Your power.

SATURDAY, 17TH

“For his Spirit joins with our spirit to affirm that we are God’s children.” Romans 8:16 (NLT)

Without the ministry of the precious Holy Spirit, no one can have assurance of being born again. He confirms the believer’s identity in Christ. It is the Holy Spirit Himself who testifies with our spirit that we are God’s children. Consider the Passion version: ***“For the Holy Spirit makes God’s fatherhood real to us as He whispers into our innermost being, ‘You are God’s beloved child!’”*** (Romans 8:16 TPT). This assurance is inward, personal, and is not dependent on feelings or circumstances.

This assurance comes from the understanding that God’s love is poured into our hearts by the Lord Holy Spirit, as written in Romans 5:5. When we are perfected in love, fear and insecurity are eliminated from our lives. 1 John 4:18a (NKJV) states: ***“There is no fear in love; but perfect love casts out fear.”*** The Spirit reveals God’s love to us, silencing doubt and uncertainty. As He does this, fear loses its power, and faith becomes steadfast.

The Spirit also delivers us from condemnation. Romans 8:1a (AMPC) says, ***“Therefore, there is now no condemnation (no adjudging guilty of wrong) for those who are in Christ Jesus.”*** The Holy Spirit reminds us of grace, not guilt. His

grace teaches us to say no to sin and ungodliness because of the awareness that we are righteous.

Assurance strengthens boldness in prayer and fellowship. Hebrews 10:22a (NLT) says, ***“Let us go right into the presence of God with sincere hearts fully trusting him.”*** The Christian no longer relates to God as a stranger but as a child.

A Christian who walks in assurance lives securely. Ephesians 1:13 (KJV) declares, ***“In whom ye also [trusted], after that ye heard the word of truth, the gospel of your salvation: in whom also after that ye believed, ye were sealed with that holy Spirit of promise.”*** This seal is God’s guarantee. Halleluyah!

CONFESSION

I am God’s child, affirmed by the Holy Spirit. Fear and condemnation have no place in my life. I walk in confidence and peace before God. My identity is secure in Christ. I live assured of God’s unfailing love.

SUNDAY, 18TH

“Let me emphasize this: As you yield to the dynamic life and power of the Holy Spirit, you will abandon the cravings of your self-life.” Galatians 5:16 (TPT)

The guidance of the Holy Spirit is what makes the difference in the life of a child of God. He leads us in the paths of righteousness for His Name’s sake. Psalms 23:3 (TPT): ***“That’s where he restores and revives my life. He opens before me the right path and leads me along in his footsteps of righteousness so that I can bring honour to his name.”*** Holy living is not the result of self-discipline, but of Spirit-discipline and leadership in a man’s life.

Our theme Scripture emphasises that if you yield to the dynamic life and power of the Lord Holy Spirit, you will abandon the cravings of your self-life. This isn’t achieved through obedience; instead, you must redirect your desires towards the Spirit.

Remember, He is constantly at work within you, guiding your will and actions towards His good pleasure and His pleasure is holy living. As Philippians 2:13 (ERV) states, ***“Yes, it is God who is working in you. He helps you want to do what pleases him and gives you the power to do it.”*** In the New Testament, holiness and holy living are entirely the work of the Holy Spirit.

The ministry of the Holy Spirit in our lives produces righteous desires. Ezekiel 36:27 (NLT) states, ***“I will put my Spirit in you so that you will follow my decrees and be careful to obey my regulations.”*** As you are now the offspring of the Word of God, you supernaturally do the Word. Prophet Ezekiel spoke to men who were given the Word to obey, but the Christian is not one who simply obeys the Word of God.

For instance, a human being does not go to the washroom, bathe, or eat as a matter of obedience to regulations; these actions are simply part of human life. Without doing these things, one cannot be considered a normal person, and it will negatively impact their health. As you are a product of the Word, you naturally live out the Word in your daily life.

1 Peter 1:23 (MSG): ***“Your new life is not like your old life. Your old birth came from mortal sperm; your new birth comes from God’s living Word. Just think: a life conceived by God himself!”***

Your divine life came from the Word of God. When you live the divine life through the Holy Spirit, you walk in holiness every day without premeditation. The Spirit enables you to manifest holiness easily because it has become your nature. Glory to Jesus in the highest.

PRAYER

Dear Lord Holy Spirit, lead my life completely. Transform my desires and actions as I yield to Your teaching, guidance, and leadership. Thank You for working in me, giving me both the will and the power to do Your will. By Your power and grace, my mind is fixed on You and what You are doing in my life. In the Name of Jesus Christ, Amen.

MONDAY, 19TH

THE HOLY SPIRIT GLORIFIES CHRIST IN YOU



“He will glorify Me, for He will take of what is Mine and declare it to you.” John 16:14 (NKJV)

The Holy Spirit’s main purpose is to glorify Jesus Christ. Our theme Scripture shows that the Spirit doesn’t draw attention to Himself but magnifies Christ. Everything the Spirit does in the life of a believer points to Jesus. A truly Spirit-led life always reveals Christ and never promotes self.

The verse also shows how the Holy Ghost glorifies Christ; He takes what is Christ’s and declares it to you. The word declare is translated from the Greek word *anaggellō* which means to show, report, rehearse or make known. The Lord Holy Spirit will only show, report, rehearse or make known what the word of God says. Remember, Jesus is the incarnate Word (John 1:1).

The Spirit glorifies Christ by producing fruit in our spirits. Galatians 5:22-23 (TPT): ***“But the fruit produced by the Holy Spirit within you is divine love in all its varied expressions: joy that overflows, peace that subdues, patience that endures, kindness in action, a life full of virtue, faith that prevails, gentleness of heart, and strength of spirit. Never set the law above these qualities, for they are meant to be limitless.”*** John 15:8 (KJV) declares,

“Herein is my Father glorified, that ye bear much fruit; so shall ye be my disciples.” Fruitfulness in our lives honours Christ. A fruitful life is a loud testimony of Christ’s lordship.

The inner workings of the Holy Spirit in our lives produce the fruit of righteousness that glorifies Christ. Philippians 1:11 (NLT) states, “May you always be filled with the fruit of your salvation—the righteous character produced in your life by Jesus Christ—for this will bring much glory and praise to God.” When Christ is seen in you, God is glorified through you.

2 Corinthians 3:18 (AMPC) says that we are constantly being transfigured into His very own image in ever increasing splendour. This transformation into Christlikeness is not achieved through performance, but rather by the Spirit. “... ***And this glorious transfiguration comes from the Lord, who is the Spirit***” (2 Corinthians 3:18 TPT).

CONFESSION

I affirm that daily, the Lord Holy Spirit works through the Word of God to transform me into the image of Jesus Christ. Christlike character is being formed in me daily from glory to glory. I see, hear, think and speak as Christ. Halleluyah! I live to exalt Jesus alone. God is glorified in and through me in Jesus’ Name, Amen.

TUESDAY, 20TH

God never begins a work and then stops it unfinished. Our theme Scripture lets us know that God always completes the work He starts. The Holy Spirit, the divine agent responsible for the completion of God's projects, working patiently within us. 2 Corinthians 3:18 (KJV) says that we are changed into the same image from glory to glory, even as by the Spirit of the Lord. Transformation is a process, not an instant occurrence.

You may be a minister of the gospel, a business person, a couple, or serving in a Church or government. Regardless of the problems, confusion, conflict, or even blackmail you encounter, God's work is not cancelled. Romans 8:28 (NLT) says, **“And we know that God causes everything to work together for the good of those who love God and are called according to his purpose for them.”** The Spirit uses even setbacks as tools to accomplish the glorious purpose of God. Nothing in your journey of life is a waste if you are a child of God.

But remember, unless you trust Him completely and rely solely on Him, the assignment will fail. Zechariah 4:6 (TPT) says,

“Here is the message of Yahweh to Zerubbabel: ‘You will not succeed through military might or your own strength, but through my Spirit,’ declares Yahweh, Commander of Angel Armies.” Realise that only God can complete what He started, not you, and He will not complete what you began on your own. Everything must align with His eternal purpose for mankind. Halleluyah!

“With his own hands, Zerubbabel has laid the foundation of this temple, and with his own hands he will finish it. Then you will know that Yahweh, Commander of Angel Armies, has sent me to you” (Zechariah 4:9 TPT). Cheer up! The foundation you’ve laid, whether in family, business, career, or ministry, your hands will finish it by the Spirit. Maybe the Lord is leading you on a spiritual journey. He could be talking to you about giving yourself wholly to the work of ministry. Trust Him, He will bring it to completion. Praise God! Halleluyah!

PRAYER

Faithful Father, I trust Your work in my life. Dear Lord Holy Spirit, I surrender totally and completely to Your purpose and I ask You to do in me what is aligned with divine purpose. I yield to Your process and timing. I ask You to help me to finish strong in Christ. Thank You for perfecting me by grace in Jesus’ Name, Amen.

WEDNESDAY, 21ST

“Come unto me, all ye that labour and are heavy laden, and I will give you rest. Take my yoke upon you, and learn of me; for I am meek and lowly in heart: and ye shall find rest unto your souls” Mathew 11:28-29 KJV

The indwelling presence of the Person of the Holy Spirit brings rest into the life of a believer. You may be disturbed or stressed because of what is happening around you today, but you must remember that God Almighty now dwells inside you, and His presence brings rest.

In today’s world, many live without peace because they don’t know the person of the Lord Holy Spirit. In our opening Scripture, however, the Lord Jesus invites us to turn our focus towards Him, saying, “Come unto me, all ye that labour and are heavy laden, and I will give you rest.”

In John 14:27 (KJV), Jesus further assures us of peace, saying, ***“Peace I leave with you, my peace I give unto you: not as the world giveth, give I unto you. Let not your heart be troubled, neither let it be afraid.”*** This ministry that Jesus spoke of is now carried out by the Person of the Holy Spirit. When the Holy Spirit dwells in you in His fullness, He gives you peace and rest. Fear and trouble no longer have dominion over you.

The Bible also declares in Isaiah 32:17 (KJV): ***“And the work of righteousness shall be peace; and the effect of righteousness, quietness and assurance for ever.”*** This kind of peace will cause people to wonder how you can remain at rest in the midst of turmoil. This is only possible because of the presence of the Holy Spirit in one's life.

As you become conscious of this reality and continually fellowship with the Holy Spirit, you will experience a peace the world cannot understand. This same peace will flow through you to others, making you a source of help and strength to those who are fearful and troubled.

In view of all this, fellowship with the Holy Spirit must be intentional. Through prayer, meditation on the Word, and obedience, believers position themselves for continuous revelation. The Holy Spirit brings God's presence into our lives and makes it real to us. In our opening Scripture, He is referred to as the **"Angel of His Presence."** The word angel means messenger—one who carries and conveys God's presence from place to place, even across the globe.

The Spirit's presence in our lives is the reason Jesus Christ is real to us and the reason we believe the Word of God. When we pray, the Holy Spirit makes God's presence tangible, drawing us close to a living God and stirring faith in our hearts. This enables us to trust, believe, and persevere.

Are you facing challenges in your family, academics, or ministry? Engage the person of the Holy Spirit, and His presence will cause you to experience fullness of joy. Psalm 16:11 (KJV) declares, ***“Thou wilt shew me the path of life: in thy presence is fulness of joy; at thy right hand there are pleasures for evermore.”***

As believers, we are called into fellowship with the Holy Spirit in our daily lives (See 1 Corinthians 1:9). Yield to His guidance, and experience the fullness of God through Him. When we understand who He is and continually desire to know Him, our lives will have no option but to move from glory to glory.

Ignoring the teaching ministry of the Holy Spirit results in spiritual stagnation. However, yielding to Him establishes us in

sound doctrine and truth. 2 Timothy 3:16 affirms that all Scripture is inspired by the Spirit of God and is profitable for doctrine, for reproof, for correction, and for instruction in righteousness. Therefore, take full advantage of the ministry of the Holy Spirit today. When He comes into your life, God will cease to be a mystery to you. You will no longer walk in the wilderness of life, for there will be light at all times.

The Holy Spirit guides and pilots our lives. He causes us to lie down in green pastures; places of provision, abundance, and peace. Through His ministry, believers are enabled to build the right relationships, engage in the right businesses, choose the right partners, and walk in the perfect will of God for their lives.

He also empowers us to walk in paths prepared for us ahead of time. Scripture reminds us in Ephesians 2:10 (KJV): ***“For***

we are his workmanship, created in Christ Jesus unto good works, which God hath before ordained that we should walk in them.” This speaks of a life intentionally designed by God, full of purpose and direction.

Therefore, live with the understanding that you are not a child of chance. The people you meet and the opportunities you encounter are not by accident; everything in your life is meant to be influenced by the Spirit of God. A Christian who maintains a relationship with the person of the Holy Spirit will not walk in error but will experience a life of ever-increasing glory

Studying Scripture reveals God's immense love for humanity. He created man in His image and likeness (Genesis 1:26), allowing man to manage the earth as God could have. However, when Adam rebelled against God, certain conditions were imposed. Sin entered the world and brought death. What used to work was no longer effective. Barrenness was introduced, and death began to work in everything. This is because man was driven away from God's presence, where His Spirit was.

Fruitfulness is a beautiful sign of the Holy Spirit's presence and influence in a believer's life. The Spirit can transform barren seasons into periods of fruitfulness and growth. Life often presents us with challenging seasons in business, career, academics, or ministry. begin to prosper in ways that surpass human effort. This means we no longer need to struggle for productivity; fruitfulness becomes a natural outcome of His presence in our lives.

The anointing of the Lord brings productivity and divine favor. It is the anointing that makes us fruitful, influences our actions, and causes our labor to succeed. Whatever we touch, whatever we undertake, prospers because the Holy Spirit is at work. As Psalm 1:3 reminds us, a person rooted in God's Spirit is like a tree planted by rivers of water, yielding fruit in its season.

The presence of the Holy Spirit turns deserts into springs, barrenness into abundance, and obstacles into opportunities. He releases growth, provision, and increase in every area of our lives. When the Spirit moves, there is fruitfulness in your right hand and your left—a double portion of blessing that flows effortlessly. He makes the impossible possible, and ensures that nothing remains stagnant under His guidance.

Therefore, do not despair in the wilderness seasons of your life. Invite the Holy Spirit to fill you afresh, to guide your steps, and to activate His anointing over your life. As you yield to Him, you will see your wilderness transformed into a fruitful field, and your fruitfulness counted for overflowing abundance. Trust the Spirit to lead, empower, and produce in you all that God has ordained.

God receives all the glory when the Holy Spirit empowers believers.

As Micah 3:8 (KJV) says, ***“But truly I am full of power by the spirit of the LORD...”*** When we yield to the Spirit, we gain fresh empowerment to fulfil God's purpose, serve effectively, and boldly walk in our calling.

Excellence through the Spirit brings favour and promotion. Daniel's consistency, integrity, and wisdom made him preferred. Psalm 75:6–7 confirms this by declaring that promotion comes from God, and not from the east or the west. When the Holy Spirit empowers a believer, God makes room for them.

Furthermore, the Spirit of excellence enables believers to represent God accurately before men. Colossians 3:23 (KJV) instructs us to do all things heartily, as unto the Lord and not unto men. Through the Holy Spirit, our work, speech, and conduct reflect the glory of God, causing others to recognize His hand upon our lives.

Excellence is sustained by continuous fellowship with the Holy Spirit. By yielding to His leading, we rise above mediocrity and complacency. Isaiah 11:2 says the Spirit of the Lord brings wisdom, understanding, counsel, might, knowledge, and the fear of the Lord, which are the pillars of a life of true excellence.

The Spirit of excellence lives in me. I stand out by the working of the Holy Spirit not by human ability. My heart is governed by the Spirit, and excellence flows naturally through my character, wisdom, discipline, and actions. SATURDAY, 31ST

THE HOLY SPIRIT MAKES YOU A SOUL WINNER



“But you shall receive power (ability, efficiency, and might) when the Holy Spirit has come upon you, and you shall be My witnesses in Jerusalem and all Judea and Samaria and to the ends (the very bounds) of the earth.” Acts 1:8 AMPC.

When a Christian receives the Holy Spirit in their life, they turn into superman. Inherent power to do what God can do is given to them. This power is actually ability, efficiency, and might to provide proof that Jesus is the Son of God. He was born of the Virgin Mary, lived and died on the cross of Calvary, and on the third day, He rose again from the dead.

Before the Holy Spirit came into the life of the Apostles, they were terrified to identify with Jesus Christ when he was arrested. Peter even denied him thrice (Matthew 26:69-74), fearing the consequences if they discovered he was one of Jesus’s disciples.

In Matthew 26:74 (TPT), Peter denied it and, using profanity, exclaimed, **“I don’t know the man!”** At that very moment, the sound of a crowing rooster pierced the night. This Peter was different from the Peter of Acts 2:4 (TPT), who was filled and equipped with the Holy Spirit, inspiring him to speak in tongues—he was literally empowered by the Spirit to speak in languages he had never learned!

When the Holy Spirit filled Peter, he immediately began proclaiming the gospel, and became a soul winner. Acts 2:14 (TPT): ***“Peter stood up with the eleven apostles and shouted to the crowd, “Listen carefully, my fellow Jews and residents of Jerusalem. You must clearly understand what’s happening here.”*** Where did he find the boldness and wisdom? The Lord Holy Ghost who dwelt in him.

The same Holy Ghost is in us today, and He came to make us first, soul winners. Our opening verse explains that we received power so that we could be witnesses unto the Lord Jesus. This is soul winning! Make up your mind this year to win souls and bring them into the Church. Glory, halleluyah!

PRAYER

Dear Lord Holy Ghost, I desire to be an effective witness of Christ every day of my life. As long as I live, I ask You to guide and strengthen me daily for soul winning.
