WHO IS MAN?

God said, Let Us [Father, Son, and Holy Spirit] make mankind in Our image, after Our likeness, and let them have complete authority over the fish of the sea, the birds of the air, the [tame] beasts, and over all of the earth, and over everything that creeps upon the earth. Genesis 1:26 AMPC

To truly understand spiritual growth, it is crucial to grasp the nature of man and his origin. Man did not originate from apes. We are creations of God, originating from God Himself. Man was created in the image and likeness of God, designed to resemble and function like God.

If man was created to resemble God and function like Him, it is important for us to understand God's appearance and capabilities. John 4:24 reveals that ***God is Spirit, and those who worship Him must do so in spirit and truth.*** Since God is Spirit, we cannot physically see Him walking and working daily.

The Scripture also lets us know that God is the Father of spirits (Heb. 12:9). In Heb. 12:23, it says... ***to the spirits of just men made perfect,*** These just men passed to glory but they are not really dead, they simply left their houses (bodies) behind. Scripture shows us that

our body is our tent or house (2 Cor. 5:1-2), designed by God with amazing variety. We do not look the same physically, but the real us looks the same. Don't be misled by the external design and painting.

1 Thessalonians 5:23 teaches that man is a spirit with a soul, having a body (house). This is irrespective of whether one is born again or not. Every living person on earth now is a spirit being with a soul, living in a body. When man sinned in the Garden of Eden, he was corrupted through the deception of Satan, and took up the nature of Satan.

With the nature of Satan, man began to sin, and death came into the world through sin. Therefore, just as through one man sin entered the world, and death through sin, and thus death spread to all men, because all sinned (Romans 5:12 NKJV). Humanity could not help themselves out of this terrible predicament. We needed a savior and this is why the Lord Jesus Christ came to earth.

CONFESSION

I am from above. I hail from God. I am born of God and therefore I overcome the world. In Him I live, move, and have my being. I look like God, I operate and function like Him. As my Father has taught me, I too say: Let there be light in my life, in my school, in my family, in my career, and in my business. Glory to God!

SPIRITS DON'T DIE

The day came that the rich man also died. In hell he looked up from his torment and saw Abraham in the distance, and Lazarus was standing beside him in the glory. Luke 16:23 TPT

What man calls death is not cessation of life but cessation of the body of man. It's like when you move away from your home area and return many years later to find a famous and iconic building demolished and no longer in existence. This is what happens to the bodies of people when they "die". The real man or woman has not died because spirits don't die.

The Word of God has several accounts of men who died in the body, yet Scripture describes them as being alive. ***"So it was that the beggar died and was carried by the angels to Abraham's bosom. The rich man also died and was buried"*** (Luke 16:22 NKJV). We see three people here: Abraham, Lazarus the beggar, and the rich man. As the story progresses, we see the rich man pleading with Abraham. He could talk and feel pain, meaning he was alive.

When someone lives and dies without being born again, they are forever separated from the Fatherhood of God. ***“It is your sins that separate you from your God. He turns away from you when he sees them”*** (Isaiah 59:2 ERV). Their spirits live forever, but in the lake of fire, apart from God.

Notice, when our Lord Jesus took the place of humanity and the sin of the world was laid on Him in His substitutionary work, He cried, ***“My God, my God, why hast thou forsaken me?”*** (Mark 15:34 KJV). This is because sin brings a separation between God and man.

Make up your mind to decide which family you will spend your eternity with because spirits don't die. If you die in your sin or without receiving Christ as your Lord and Savior, you will spend eternity in the lake of fire. Death and hell will be cast into the lake of fire (Revelation 20:14). Think about it: If the rich man was crying in hell, what will he do in the lake of fire? This terrible place is not God's desire for you. Pray the prayer of salvation at the back of this book to receive God's gift of eternal life today.

CONFESSION

Father, I thank You for Your Word and for the gift of salvation. I declare that death has no power over my spirit, for I live forever in Christ Jesus. My sins are forgiven, and my relationship with God is fully restored. I belong to the family of God, redeemed and secure for eternity. In Jesus' Name, Amen.



YOU CAN CHANGE FATHERHOOD

But as many as received him, to them gave he power to become the sons of God, even to them that believe on his name. John 1:12 KJV

When it comes to dealing with the things of the Spirit, don't accept assumptions because they can have a very dire impact on your life. If you are reading this devotional, God led you to do so. Take the message very seriously.

Have you ever heard someone say we are all children of God? What a lie and deception! ***Jesus said, "Then if God were really your father, you would love me, ... "You are the offspring of your father, the devil, and you serve your father very well, passionately carrying out his desires..."*** (John 8:42, 44 TPT).

According to John 8:42 and 44, Jesus Christ Himself clearly stated that some people on earth belong to the family of Satan, whom He considers their father. This is because they are not born again. They faithfully serve the devil and carry out His desires with passion. They possess his fallen nature. People sin because of

their sinful nature, and as long as they are not born again, that nature of the devil will remain in them. No amount of religion or discipline can change it.

God created everything, including all people, as stated in John 1:3. Jesus Christ came to His creation, but they received Him not (John 1:11).

How can one change fatherhood?

John 1:12 provides the answer: ***“But to as many as did receive and welcome Him, He gave the authority (power, privilege, right) to become the children of God, that is, to those who believe in (adhere to, trust in, and rely on) His name”*** (AMPC). If verse 11 is saying that He came to His children, verse 12 loses its meaning!

2 Corinthians 5:17 further describes this glorious transition from Satan’s fatherhood to the family of God. When you come into Christ Jesus, you become a new creature, a completely new species without a past. Your spirit is recreated in true righteousness and holiness (Ephesians 4:24). Hallelujah!

CONFESSION

Father, in the Name of the Lord Jesus Christ, I thank You for making me Your child. I am now righteous, sanctified, and holy. I declare that I am a new creation; all things of the past have passed away. Behold, I am a new person in Christ. Hallelujah!

WE ARE A CHOSEN RACE

That at that time you were without Christ, being aliens from the commonwealth of Israel and strangers from the covenants of promise, having no hope and without God in the world. But now in Christ Jesus you who once were far off have been brought near by the blood of Christ. Ephesians 2:12-13 NKJV

From God's perspective, there are three races on the face of the earth (1 Corinthians 10:32). The first race is the Jews; God's chosen people who relate to Him through the covenant He made with Abraham and the laws and ordinances revealed by Moses.

The second race is the Greeks (Gentiles); nations without any conscious relationship with God. These are non-Jews and are not physical descendants of Abraham. The Bible describes them as natural men who do not receive the things of the Spirit of God (1 Corinthians 2:14). Whereas these people are controlled by their physical senses, the things of God are spiritually discerned.

The third race is the church of God, the new creation in Christ. Every child of God belongs here! Apostle Peter says we are ***a chosen race, a royal priesthood, a dedicated nation, God's own purchased, special***

people, that we may set forth the wonderful deeds and display the virtues and perfections of God (1 Peter 2:9 AMPC).

There are distinctions even in the chosen race: First there is the spiritual man; one who has come to maturity. This spiritual man examines everything, but he is not judged by anyone. He can understand everything, but no one can truly know him (1 Corinthians 2:15).

Then we have babes in Christ. Some of the features of the babes in Christ include not being able to talk, having envy, strife, and divisions (1 Corinthians 3:1-3). These need the milk of the Word of God to grow and fully develop. ***“As newborn babes, desire the pure milk of the word, that you may grow thereby”*** (1 Peter 2.2 NKJV).

CONFESSION

I am a special race, chosen by God and recreated in Christ Jesus to show forth His glory. I examine, investigate, make inquiries into, question, and discern all things by the Spirit of God. I feed on the Word of God and grow by it daily. Hallelujah!



WHAT IS SPIRITUAL GROWTH

In the same way that nursing infants cry for milk, you must intensely crave the pure spiritual milk of God's Word. For this "milk" will cause you to grow into maturity, fully nourished and strong for life — 1 Peter 2:2 TPT

We learned earlier that man is a spirit with a soul, living in a body (house). This truth is crucial to the accurate understanding of spiritual growth. Our opening verse compares natural growth and development of a baby to spiritual growth and development of a person's spirit.

Spiritual growth is the transformation of the Christian into the very image of Christ, from glory to glory, through the ministry of the Word and the Holy Spirit. As we continue to behold the glory of the Lord in the Word of God, we are constantly being transfigured into His very own image in ever increasing splendor and from one degree of glory to another. This transformation comes from the Lord, Who is the Spirit (2 Corinthians 3:18 AMPC).

When you made Jesus Christ your Lord, you received a new life, the very life and nature of God. You were

regenerated (born again), not from a mortal origin, but from one that is immortal by the ever-living Word of God (1 Peter 1:23 AMPC).

You are awakened to the Fatherhood of God Almighty, but you have to be trained to live this God-life. When you are trained, and you start living this life, we refer to it as spiritual growth. The ongoing inner transformation is reflected in your character and way of life after some time.

Spiritual growth, like natural growth, requires continuous nourishment to thrive. It's a lifelong commitment to nurture your spirit and live a glorious life. Blessed be God!

CONFESSION

I thank You, Lord, for the divine nature I have received in my spirit. I am regenerated, renewed, and alive in Christ Jesus. I declare that I am immortal, filled with Your glory, and empowered to walk in victory. In Jesus' Name. Amen.

WHY SPIRITUAL GROWTH 1

And God said, Let the earth bring forth grass, the herb yielding seed, and the fruit tree yielding fruit after his kind, whose seed is in itself, upon the earth: and it was so. And the earth brought forth grass, and herb yielding seed after his kind, and the tree yielding fruit, whose seed was in itself, after his kind: and God saw that it was good. Genesis 1:11-12 KJV

We saw yesterday from 1 Corinthians 3:1-3 that God's chosen race has two categories of people: the fully grown spiritual man and the immature babes. Clearly, there are babies in the church of Christ but God does not want them to remain as such.

Why does God want us to grow?

First and foremost, growth is natural for living things. God imbued every seed with the divine capacity for growth. We are born from the incorruptible seed of God's Word (1 Peter 1:23), so we have the ability to grow. The Scripture tells us for instance that John the Baptist grew physically and spiritually (Luke 1:80). We are likewise expected to grow both physically and spiritually.

Secondly, spiritual growth is linked to multiplication. God expects seeds to multiply, and they can only do

so when they mature. Jesus, as a seed, grew and became strong in the spirit (Luke 2:40). When He rose from the dead, He brought multiplication through salvation to the kingdom of God (John 12:24).

Lack of fruit brings a curse. Once, when Jesus was hungry, he saw a fig tree with leaves and approached it, expecting to find fruit. When he found none, He cursed it (Mark 11:12-21).

Thirdly, spiritual growth brings stability in your life. Spiritual babies are unstable (Ephesians 4:14), and when you are unstable, you cannot excel (Genesis 49:4). When you are a baby, it is difficult for you to receive from your Father God. ***“When you are half-hearted and wavering, it leaves you unstable. Can you really expect to receive anything from the Lord when you’re in that condition?”*** (James (Jacob) 1:7-8 TPT).

PRAYER

Father, in the Name of the Lord Jesus Christ, I thank You for the seed of Your Word in me that gives me life and enables me to grow. As I feed on Your Word, I receive light to grow and multiply. I do exploits, win souls, and advance the Kingdom of God. Amen.



WHY SPIRITUAL GROWTH II

Woe to thee, O land, when thy king is a child, and thy princes eat in the morning! Ecclesiastes 10:16 KJV

According to God's design, only adults ought to assume leadership and rule. When you gave your heart to Christ, Scripture lets us know that you were made a King and priest: ***“and hath made us kings and priests unto God and his Father; to him be glory and dominion for ever and ever. Amen”*** (Revelation 1:6 KJV).

In Romans 5:17, God's Word states that those who receive abundance of grace and of the gift of righteousness will reign in life by one, Jesus Christ. This is absolute truth, but notice the aspect of abundance of grace. Only mature men have received/collected abundance of grace.

The fourth reason for growth is rulership. Our opening verse declares woe over the land, whose king is a child, because children are not meant to reign. They are unstable, as we saw in yesterday's study. The

Apostle Paul told Timothy not to appoint a spiritual baby in leadership (1 Timothy 3:6). In the Old Testament, children's leadership was an evidence of a curse on the land (Isaiah 3:4-5 & 12).

The fifth reason for spiritual growth is receiving your inheritance or managing your estate (Galatians 4:1-2). Children of God, who are babies, cannot fully enjoy what belongs to them in the spirit realm. They cannot be in charge of properties or anything of the kingdom; decisions must be made for them.

The sixth reason for growth is that if you remain a spiritual babe, you are not any different from a slave. ***“Think of it this way. If a father dies and leaves an inheritance for his young children, those children are not much better off than slaves until they grow up, even though they actually own everything their father had”*** (Galatians 4:1 NLT). Just imagine what life slaves live; that is the lot of babies! Purpose to grow up and manage your estate. Glory to Jesus in the highest!

CONFESSION

Thank You, LORD, for making me a king and a priest in Christ Jesus. I rule and reign with authority over every situation, circumstance, and element of this earth. I live above every limitation, every attack, and every system of this world. Hallelujah!

WHY SPIRITUAL GROWTH III

So it is with us. When we were juveniles we were enslaved under the hostile spirits of the world. Galatians 4:3 TPT

Many of God's children are pursuing what they are not supposed to put their energy into, and neglecting the most important thing—the Word of God! The Scripture says to desire the sincere milk of the Word, as a newborn babe, that you may grow thereby (1 Peter 2:2 KJV). You are not going to achieve much or enjoy your life as a Christian unless you prioritize your spiritual growth.

The seventh reason for spiritual growth is freedom from hostile spirits. Our theme Scripture says that children are enslaved by hostile spirits of the world. This makes them worldly as these spirits cause them to think, talk, and act like unbelievers. Sicknesses, depression, stress, quarrels, and endless fights are all caused by these spirits. Why would you want to live like this when God wants you to live like Jesus Christ?

Children are never taken seriously because they are

controlled by external forces. The spiritually mature are controlled by an internal force, their trained spirit. ***“When I was a child, I spoke as a child, I understood as a child, I thought as a child; but when I became a man, I put away childish things”*** (1 Corinthians 13:11 NKJV).

Spiritual babes speak, then understand and think, but the spiritually mature think, understand and then speak. They have developed their spiritual senses by reason of use of the Word of righteousness. ***“But solid food belongs to those who are of full age, that is, those who by reason of use have their senses exercised to discern both good and evil”*** (Hebrews 5:14 NKJV)

Spiritual children require emancipation. They cannot be trusted with responsibility. Decisions are made for them. Responsibility only comes with maturity.

CONFESSION

Thank You, Lord, for Your Word. As I continually feed on it, I am built up and developed to handle greater responsibilities. I grow in wisdom, understanding, and faith, progressing from glory to glory. Amen.

SIN WAS REMITTED

To bring and give the knowledge of salvation to His people in the forgiveness and remission of their sins. Luke 1:77 AMPC

Forgiveness and remission are different. Forgiveness doesn't erase sins, while remission means completely wiping them away. In the Old Testament, the Israelites offered sacrifices for forgiveness, but the need for more sacrifices every year meant that their sins were never completely taken away. ***“But [as it is] these sacrifices annually bring a fresh remembrance of sins [to be atoned for], Because the blood of bulls and goats is powerless to take sins away” (Hebrews 10:3-4 AMPC).***

When Jesus came and offered His life as a sacrifice for humanity, the sin of humanity was remitted. ***“So repent (change your mind and purpose); turn around and return to God, that your sins may be erased (blotted out, wiped clean), that times of refreshing (of recovering from the effects of heat, of reviving with fresh air) may come from the presence of the Lord” (Acts 3:19 AMPC).*** Jesus didn't just forgive our sins; He completely erased them. His blood doesn't just offer pardon; it totally wipes away all sin. Hallelujah

Remember, it is the sin of the world, not the sin of the Christian that Jesus remitted and wiped away. *“The very next day, John saw Jesus coming to him to be baptized, and John cried out, “Look! There he is—God’s Lamb! He takes away the sin of the entire world!”* (John 1:29 TPT). He took away the sin of the entire world. He loves you, and He is not mad at you because of your sin.

The entire world has been reconciled to God (2 Corinthians 5:19 NKJV). God reconciled the world, not the Christian. There’s no record of sin against you, child of God. Please believe what God thinks of you, and not what the world or any religious leader is telling you.

Anyone who believes in the Lord Jesus Christ becomes a New Creation (2 Corinthians 5:17). This means you have no past; only the present and future. Start seeing yourself as a new creation and experience change in your blood, bones, and mind. See the new you in Christ. Hallelujah! You cannot grow spiritually unless you understand what our Lord Jesus did for you. Sin consciousness hinders spiritual growth.

CONFESSIOIN

I am forgiven, my sins were remitted. I am free, and I am a New Creation. I refuse to be conscious of the past, I am conscious of who I am in Christ. Today I choose to behold only the new me in Christ, and I walk in this consciousness and reality. Hallelujah!

CHOOSE TO GROW

So the child grew and became strong in spirit, and was in the deserts till the day of his manifestation to Israel. Luke 1:80 NKJV

The theme verse makes mention of John the Baptist's growth and spiritual strength. A similar account is found concerning the child Jesus in Luke 2:40.

To properly understand spiritual growth, observe the growth of a natural man. A baby is conceived, they grow in their mother's womb, and are born after nine months. They need constant nourishment to grow. Spiritual growth progresses in a similar manner. Just as children need a home, the Church is our home. Just as mothers feed their babies, pastors and spiritual leaders feed us with knowledge and understanding (Jeremiah 3:15).

Prayer alone won't make you grow. You must balance it with the Word. Desire the sincere milk of the Word to grow (1 Peter 2:2). Consistently participate in church programs such as Sunday Services and mid-week

Patria Movement Gatherings where you are fed with the Word. God cares for His children and provides them with shepherds/pastors for their nourishment.

Growth isn't a miracle; it's an intentional and correct application of revealed means and principles. As parents, we must choose for our children to grow, and as adults, we must make the choice to grow and develop. Growth brings excitement and joy to every parent and everyone who achieves it.

Do you desire to be strong spiritually? Then desire or choose to grow because the Lord Holy Spirit can only strengthen what is developed and grown. ***“Afterward, their son grew up and was strengthened by the Holy Spirit...”*** (Luke 1:80 TPT). Both John the Baptist and our Lord Jesus Christ were strengthened or became strong in spirit after they grew.

This term strong is translated from the Greek word **krataioō** which also means to empower, to increase in vigor, to be strengthened. We can also use the words to be divinely fortified. There must be conscious yieldedness and acknowledgment of the person of Holy Spirit in order for Him to minister strength to you.

CONFESSION

Father, I thank You for Your Words. I thank You for the Pastors You have given me, to feed me with Your Word. I declare that as I feed on Your Word, I grow. I grow in wisdom, in knowledge and in understanding. I am strong in the Lord and in the power of His Might. I am strong and I do mighty exploits in the Name of the Lord Jesus. Amen!

The early church of Jesus Christ had an undeniable impact on their nation, culture, and society because of their choice to consistently follow the apostles' teachings. *"Many wonders and miraculous signs were happening through the apostles, and everyone felt great respect for God"* (Acts 2:43 ERV). If you want to grow and develop into a spiritual adult, you must feed consistently and on the right diet.

The opening verse highlights the manner of life of those who received the gospel first; their growth and subsequent propagation of the message to other parts of the world. They dedicated their time to listening to the teachings of the apostles, sharing everything with each other, eating together, and praying together. They believed, followed, and acted on the teachings of the apostles. The early believers' growth was not accidental; their consistent adherence to their church's teachings fostered stability, growth, and power.

There are some of God's children today who ridicule the importance of belonging to a local church; that's inconsistent with the plain teaching of the Word of God. You must belong to a church family where you are raised to become a responsible son or daughter. Don't admire children from other families and keep moving from one family to another; it won't help you grow properly.

The Word of God is designed to build and establish us in Christ. Acts 20:32 affirms that it has the power to build us up and grant us an inheritance among the sanctified. Each time you receive the Word with understanding, it raises you up, fostering spiritual growth and the construction of a solid foundation within your spirit.

As you give yourself wholly to feeding on God's word consistently, your progress becomes visible. Your words change, your faith grows, and your life aligns with God's purpose. Spiritual consistency in the Word leads to partaking of your inheritance in Christ, and undeniable results that glorify God and bless others. Hallelujah!

PRAYER

Father, in the Name of Jesus, I thank You for Your Word that builds and establishes me. I declare that I am consistent in feeding on the Word. I grow in strength, wisdom, and faith. SPIRITUAL COMMUNICATION

Brothers and sisters, when I was with you I found it impossible to speak to you as those who are spiritually mature people, for you are still dominated by the mind-set of the flesh. And because you are immature infants in Christ, 1 Corinthians 3:1 TPT

Certain types of communication are not appropriate for a one-year-old child. For instance, you can't discuss investments with them because of their age. As they mature, their minds develop and they begin to understand higher and more complicated concepts.

Paul the Apostle explains that spiritual communication is impossible with a spiritual baby because they can't understand what you say. ***“But the natural man receiveth not the things of the Spirit of God: for they are foolishness unto him: neither can he know them, because they are spiritually discerned”*** (1 Corinthians 2:14 KJV). Spiritual communication is beyond the comprehension of a baby Christian, no matter how hard they may try to understand it. Only through God's Word and the Spirit can one interpret spiritual messages.

As a Father, God understands the growth of the babe in Christ and communicates according to their spiritual capacity. Revelation is not withheld from them because God wants to, but because they cannot understand it.

Just as infants are given milk and not solid food, spiritual babies are limited in what they can receive from God. God intentionally limits revelation based on their level of spiritual understanding. According to 1 Corinthians 3:1-3, Christians who remain babies in Christ can only receive milk.

To grasp deeper truths, one must cultivate their spiritual senses and renew their mind with the Word of God. Spiritual immaturity limits communication to infantile comprehension. God may wish to discuss purpose, leadership, authority, or His will in depth, but immaturity limits the conversation. The problem lies not in God's willingness to reveal truth, but in the baby's capacity to comprehend it.

PRAYER

Father, I thank You for the revelation of Your Word to me daily. As I feed on Your Word, exercise and act on it, I am strengthened with might in my inner man to do great exploits, in the Name of the Lord, Jesus Christ. Amen.

YOU ARE A VICTOR IN CHRIST JESUS

According as his divine power hath given unto us all things that pertain unto life and godliness, through the knowledge of him that hath called us to glory and virtue. 2 Peter 1:3 KJV

Many Christians live as victims of circumstances, struggling like natural men. This isn't because God hasn't provided; it's because they lack knowledge of what He has already made available in Christ. Scripture is clear: ***"God has given us all things that pertain to life and godliness."***

However, Hosea 4:6 warns that God's people can still be destroyed, not for lack of provision but for lack of knowledge. Spiritual babies are new creations in Christ Jesus but their knowledge of spiritual matters is limited and so is their experience.

Spiritual maturity comes from constantly feeding on God's Word. This develops your spiritual senses to know God, yourself, your possessions, Satan, and his authority. The Word of God teaches you how to live the Kingdom life. A spiritual adult is one who lives by and in the Word, led by the Holy Spirit.

In life, what you spend most of your time listening to and doing occupies your mind and shapes your knowledge. For instance, a mechanic who works on Toyota cars will know more about them and be able to easily diagnose their problems based on his interactions with them. Similarly, to live as a victor in Christ, you must choose to study the Word of God, meditate on it, talk it consistently, and live it daily.

Sadly, many Christians remain ignorant, leading to spiritual confusion, depression, weakness, poverty, and subjection to worldly systems. However, spiritual growth is the solution to all challenges. As you grow in the Word, you gain insight into what you have in Christ Jesus and walk in the victory that is yours in Him. Blessed be God.

PRAYER

Father, in the Name of the Lord Jesus Christ, I thank You for who I am in Christ. I declare that I am not a victim but a victor. I grow daily in the knowledge of Your Word, and my eyes are enlightened to know my inheritance, authority, and position in Christ. But grow [spiritually mature] in the grace and knowledge of our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ. To Him be glory (honor, majesty, splendor), both now and to the day of eternity. Amen. 2 Peter 3:18 AMP

Prioritize spiritual growth because it is crucial for all aspects of your life. Every problem men face today stems from the spirit world so, when you understand how it functions, you have an advantage. You can take charge and control what goes on in the physical world. Even those in satan's kingdom who understand how the spirit world works, control and inflict pain on the rest who are void of this understanding.

The Word of God informs us that babies are subject to hostile spirits. ***“So also, when we were underage, we were in slavery under the elemental spiritual forces of the world”*** (Galatians 4:3 NIV). These spiritual forces inflict pain and keep young Christians in bondage as long as they remain babies. However, when they grow up, they walk free from every affliction of the enemy. Spiritual growth is a function of the knowledge of the truth.

Maybe you are going through grave challenges right now and you are thinking that if you could get a certain amount of money, then your problems would be over. No, real solutions come only through growth. It is in your knowledge of the truth. **“...But through knowledge shall the just be delivered.”** (Proverbs 11:9 KJV). If you require deliverance, get in the Word, grow and walk free. Glory to Jesus Christ forever!

In John 8:32, Jesus said to the Jews, **“And you shall know the truth, and the truth shall make you free”** (NKJV). Walking free from spiritual enslavement is a result of knowledge gained through spiritual growth. It’s the knowledge you have acquired by yourself through the ministry of the Holy Spirit that makes you free, not the knowledge of your pastor, spiritual leader, or church. Take decisive action and grow. Hallelujah!

CONFESSION

I understand that true victory begins in the spirit, and through the knowledge of God’s truth, I gain the advantage in every battle. I am no longer a spiritual child, subject to bondage or hostile forces. I grow daily in the Word, and as I grow, I walk in freedom. Through the knowledge of the truth, I am delivered. Hallelujah!

YOUR GROWTH EXCITES GOD

Isaac continued to grow, and soon he was old enough to begin eating solid food. So Abraham gave a big party. Genesis 21:8 ERV

Some Christians have not yet come to know God as our dearest beloved Father. They have read and believed everything about the God of wrath, the consuming fire, and the God of terror. True, God is all that to His enemies, but you are not His enemy. If you are in Christ Jesus, you are His beloved child!

When you were born again, you became a child of God. ***“Your new life is not like your old life. Your old birth came from mortal sperm; your new birth comes from God’s living Word. Just think: a life conceived by God himself!”*** (1 Peter 1:23 MSG). When you made Jesus Christ the Lord of your life, you were recreated in righteousness and true holiness (Ephesians 4:24). Right now, you have the same life and nature that God Himself has.

The Word of God shows us how God thinks, just look at our theme verse. Abraham who was a friend of God threw a great party when Isaac grew and was weaned. He was excited because of the growth of his

son. The same is true of our Father God. Remember, when you are born again, a party is thrown in heaven. ***“That’s the way God responds every time one lost sinner repents and turns to him. He says to all his angels, ‘Let’s have a joyous celebration, for the one who was lost, I have found!’ ”*** (Luke 15:10 TPT).

If this is how God responds to one conversion, we may deduce that He is as excited when His children are weaned from feeding on milk. Notice the language of the Apostle Paul, he didn’t sound impressed by the Corinthian saints’ lack of growth: ***“I had to nurse you and feed you with “milk,” not with the solid food of more advanced teachings, because you weren’t ready for it. In fact, you are still not ready to be fed solid food,”*** (1 Corinthians 3:2 TPT).

When we are growing spiritually, God is excited and full of joy. He is fulfilled because it is His dream to see us fully grown. We saw in the earlier articles the various reasons for spiritual growth. When we are partaking in our inheritance, God is excited because He made those things available for us, but as long as you are a baby Christian, you cannot make use of what belongs to you in Christ. Grow up and bring joy to your Heavenly Father. Glory.

CONFESSION

I have been born again by the living Word of God. I carry His life and His nature within me. I am recreated in righteousness and true holiness. I embrace spiritual growth. I step into all that belongs to me in Christ. I live as a true son, fully grown and walking in divine purpose. Hallelujah!

TRUTH IS SPIRITUALLY UNDERSTOOD

Someone living on an entirely human level rejects the revelations of God's Spirit, for they make no sense to him. He can't understand the revelations of the Spirit because they are only discovered by the illumination of the Spirit. 1 Corinthians 2:14 TPT

Over the decades and ages, man has tried to rediscover his roots through reading, praying, and offering sacrifices to deities in a bid to reconnect with them. This is because man is a divine being; a spirit that can only be fulfilled when he lives spiritually. The true freedom of any man is found in living a spiritual life.

But how is man going to reconnect with deity and live spiritually? How will man understand God and know how to live and walk with Him? Through God's word. Our opening Scripture lets us know that a natural man cannot receive spiritual things from God; neither can he understand them, because spiritual things are spiritually understood.

"...He can't understand..." (1 Corinthians 2:14 TPT). This means that even if he tries, he will still fail to understand. The teachings are illogical, folly, and meaningless nonsense to him. Until and unless this man becomes born again, no single spiritual thing will

ever make sense to him, because they are spiritually understood.

True spiritual growth is the product of sitting with and walking with the person of the Holy Spirit. No one knows what is in a man except the spirit of that man. In the same way, the Holy Spirit is the only person who can reveal to us the things of God, and He does that in and to our spirits. This is why spiritual growth becomes essential.

When our spirits are uneducated, they can't comprehend the Holy Spirit's message. Think of it this way: if you've never learned English or any other language, you're lost whenever you encounter people speaking it. You cannot act or make decisions based on their words. The exact same thing happens in the spirit world. Spiritual growth revolves around learning the language of the Holy Spirit, which is the Word of God.

CONFESSION



SIGNS OF SPIRITUAL IMMATURITY

For you are still [unspiritual, having the nature] of the flesh [under the control of ordinary impulses]. For as long as [there are] envying and jealousy and wrangling and factions among you, are you not unspiritual and of the flesh, behaving yourselves after a human standard and like mere (unchanged) men? 1 Corinthians 3:3 AMPC.

The Word of God doesn't leave anyone in the dark concerning any matter. We have dealt with spiritual growth, so how can we know someone who is spiritually mature? How do I differentiate between spiritual growth and immaturity? ***"HOWEVER, BRETHREN, I could not talk to you as to spiritual [men], but as to nonspiritual [men of the flesh, in whom the carnal nature predominates], as to mere infants [in the new life] in Christ [unable to talk yet!]"*** (1 Corinthians 3:1 AMPC). The first sign of spiritual immaturity is being unable to talk spiritually.

A child born into the world must learn human language and speech. Through natural experiences, they're educated and conditioned to think, talk, and act in a certain way. Similarly, when you're born again, you must be taught spiritual knowledge and begin thinking, talking, and acting in a spiritual manner. Just as children imitate their parents, you must imitate your Father. ***"THEREFORE BE imitators of God [copy Him and follow His example], as well-beloved children [imitate their father]"*** (Ephesians 5:1 AMPC).

The second sign is being controlled by ordinary impulses. This is further explained in 1 Corinthians 3:3, which lists envy, jealousy, wrangling, and factions as signs of spiritual immaturity. Remember, being a pastor or church leader doesn't mean you're spiritually mature. We have seen ministers of the gospel display these signs, which means, according to God, they're immature.

Third, the spiritually immature person has not understood the revelation or teaching of righteousness: ***“For every spiritual infant who lives on milk is not yet pierced by the revelation of righteousness”*** (Hebrews 5:13 TPT). As long as you have not yet been pierced by the revelation of the righteousness of faith, God takes you as a spiritual baby. If you believe you must perform specific actions such as fasting, giving, praying or making sacrifices to gain approval from God, you are not yet mature in your faith.

The fourth sign is being unskillful in the use of the word: ***“For everyone who continues to feed on milk is obviously inexperienced and unskilled in the doctrine of righteousness...!”*** (Hebrews 5:13 AMPC). The spiritually immature person hasn't learned how to use the sword of the Spirit to deal with contrary spiritual forces.

CONFESSION

My words are seasoned with truth, wisdom, and faith. I imitate my Heavenly Father. I copy His character. I walk in love, righteousness, and holiness as His beloved child. I am not controlled by envy, jealousy, strife, or division.



LAYING A PROPER FOUNDATION

By now you should have had enough time to become teachers, but you need someone to teach you the fundamentals, the first principles of God's word. It's like you need to go back to baby milk instead of solid food! Hebrews 5:12 FBV

In the building profession, a structure must have a proper foundation if it is going to last and serve its intended purpose. Without a proper foundation, the building can easily collapse during storms and other adverse environmental conditions. Our Lord Jesus Christ taught about the importance of foundation. ***“Everyone that hears the words I say, and follows them, is like a wise man who built his house on solid rock”*** (Matthew 7:24 FBV).

In this portion of Scripture, the Lord brings something critical to our attention: ***“The rain poured down, and the floods rose, and the winds blew hard against the house, but it didn't fall down, because its foundations were on solid rock”*** (Matthew 7:25 FBV). He gave us prior knowledge that a day would come when the rain pours down and the floods rise. Only the wise, who build their houses on solid rock, will remain standing.

Until you cooperate with the Lord Holy Spirit, you will be building on sand (without any solid foundation).

You should allow the Lord Jesus Christ to build you. He has appointed ministers in the church to teach you His ways. Believe and act on the truth you are receiving. ***“I give you the name Peter, a stone. And this rock will be the bedrock foundation on which I will build my church—my legislative assembly, and the power of death will not be able to overpower it!”*** (Matthew 16:18 TPT).

The Lord Jesus Christ is building you (His church) through the teachings of your spiritual leaders. Never ever take them lightly. Apply them in your daily lives, because this is how you build on solid rock. When you do this, you lay a proper foundation for your ever increasing wealth, glory, victory, success and prosperity. Hallelujah! Like Abraham our father, set your eyes of faith on eternal things, on the unseen city (Hebrews 11:10 TPT).

Acting on the Word is the wisdom for experiencing life and immortality and the only true way of walking in the Kingdom blessing. ***“But be doers of the Word [obey the message], and not merely listeners to it, betraying yourselves [into deception by reasoning contrary to the Truth]”*** (James 1:22 AMPC). Don’t deceive yourself and let the storms of life wash you away tomorrow. Do the Word and win always. Glory!

CONFESSION

I am wisely building my life on the solid rock of God’s Word. Jesus Christ is my sure foundation, and I stand firm in Him. I cooperate with the Holy Spirit daily. I allow the Lord Jesus to build me through His Word and through the teachings of those He has placed over my life.

THE THREE STAGES OF SPIRITUAL GROWTH.

I write unto you, fathers, because ye have known him that is from the beginning. I write unto you, young men, because ye have overcome the wicked one. I write unto you, little children, because ye have known the Father. 1 John 2:13 KJV

Unlike natural growth, spiritual growth requires intentional effort. ***“When I was a child, I spoke as a child; I understood as a child, I thought as a child; but when I became a man, I put away childish things”*** (1 Corinthians 13:11 NKJV).

Our opening Scripture illustrates that as Christians, we experience three stages of spiritual development, mirroring the natural progression of human growth. It is important that we understand these stages of growth to avoid frustration, having wrong expectations, and judging both ourselves and others harshly. The Bible identifies the first stage as little children. Apostle Peter refers to them as newborn babes in Christ. These must crave the pure milk of the Word in order to grow (1 Peter 2:2).

The newborn babies have features similar to a person who is not a Christian; they live according to the dictates of the flesh, are acquainted with forgiveness of sins and the love of the Father (1 John 2:12-13). They are jealous, envious, full of themselves, and do not

know how to talk spiritually (1 Corinthians 3:1–3 AMPC).

In the second stage, young men have developed spiritual strength and authority in Christ. Apostle John, inspired by the Spirit, writes to them, declaring, ***“I write to you, young people, because you have defeated the Evil One”*** (1 John 2:13b ERV). These young men have a deep understanding of the Word of God and are exercising their authority in Christ. This stage is characterized by spiritual strength, discipline and growing confidence.

The final stage is fathers. John writes, ***“I write to you, fathers, Because you have known Him who is from the beginning”*** (1 John 2:13 NKJV). Their knowledge of God is profound and enduring, experiential and stable. They are not easily swayed by circumstances, having grown into the stability described in Hebrews 5:14. Most importantly; fathers reproduce themselves, raising and discipling others into maturity as Paul instructed in 2 Timothy 2:2.

Understanding these stages helps us grow correctly and treat others wisely. God does not expect babies to function like fathers. Fathers must exercise patience with the babies while the babies must desire to progress in their spiritual growth journey.

CONFESSION

I am born of the Word, I grow by the Word. As I feed on the Word, I advance in spiritual strength, stability, ability and maturity. By the Word, I am perfected for every good work.

SPIRITUAL STABILITY

That we henceforth be no more children, tossed to and fro, and carried about with every wind of doctrine, by the sleight of men, and cunning craftiness, whereby they lie in wait to deceive. Ephesians 4:14 KJV

The church of Jesus Christ is well structured. The Lord has anointed and appointed ministry gifts and has given them to the church for the perfecting of the saints for the work of ministry (Ephesians 4:12).

Why is it that he gives us these special abilities to do certain things best? It is so that God's people will be equipped to do better work for him, building up the Church (the Body of Christ) to a position of strength and maturity.

The word perfecting in Ephesians 4:12 is translated from a Greek root word **katartizō**, which means to frame, fit, repair, complete, mend what has been broken, and complete furnishing or equipping. So, Apostles, Prophets, Evangelists, Pastors, and Teachers have been given to the Church for the complete furnishing or equipping of the saints. Their training brings the saints to a position of strength and maturity.

Spiritual stability is a result of consciously following

what you have been taught and putting the knowledge into practice: ***“Rooted and built up in him, and stablished in the faith, as ye have been taught, abounding therein with thanksgiving”*** (Colossians 2:7 KJV).

Begin by practicing what your pastor or spiritual leader is teaching you about spiritual stability.

Our opening verse shows us that when we receive the ministry of these gifts in the Church, we shall no more be children, tossed to and fro and carried about by every wind of doctrine. Our lives will be free from the deception and instability, which characterize the life of spiritual babes.

Every one of us needs these ministry gifts. If you think you don't need one, you are already living in deception. You must belong to a family where the elders can teach, rebuke, correct, and train you in righteousness. Nobody is an island. You are strong, fortified, and formidable in the church family. Hallelujah!

CONFESSION

I am being perfected and fully furnished for every good work. I grow in strength and maturity in Christ. I am rooted and built up in Him. I am established in the faith as I have been taught. I practice the Word with gratitude and consistency. Hallelujah!

THE LORD WANTS YOU TO MULTIPLY

Any branch in Me that does not bear fruit [that stops bearing] He cuts away (trims off, takes away); and He cleanses and repeatedly prunes every branch that continues to bear fruit, to make it bear more and richer and more excellent fruit. John 15:2 AMPC

Throughout the Word of God, we see that the LORD's desire is for His children to come to maturity. Why is that so? It is because anything associated with God must increase and multiply! He is not impressed with stagnation, unfruitfulness, and barrenness. Whenever and wherever Christ governs, ever-increasing glory and progress are evident.

“Of the increase of His government and of peace there shall be no end, upon the throne of” (Isaiah 9:7a AMPC). This verse shows us that the increase of God's government, rulership, dominion and building shall have no end. If He is truly governing your life, church, family or business, there must be proof of His government's increase and multiplication.

However, much as the Lord's desires that His children bear fruit, multiply, and increase, He does not expect fruit from immature sons and daughters. If you are a farmer, you do not expect to find fruit from seedlings in the nursery. Fruit develops on the branches, and

branches grow on mature plants. The Lord has made provision for us to grow so that we can produce fruit.

Fruitfulness brings glory and honor to Him, and it is also a mark of a true disciple: **“When you bear (produce) much fruit, My Father is honored and glorified, and you show and prove yourselves to be true followers of Mine”** (John 15:8 AMPC). You must intentionally plan your spiritual growth so that there are branches on you. The materials you need to grow and develop are within your reach; start by consistently listening to the teachings of your Pastor.

Secondly, participate in your church programs such as services, Patria Movement, soul winning, or any training. Desire to become a teacher of others. Remember, there’s no such thing as church members; the Lord sees disciples who are making disciples.

“For even though by this time you ought to be teaching others,” (Hebrews 5:12a AMPC). Apostle Paul showed us the mind of the Spirit for the Hebrew believers. He expected them to be teachers by this time, but they were not.

Heavenly Father, I thank You because it is Your desire for me to grow to maturity. I declare that Christ governs my life. SET ASIDE CHILDISH WAYS

When I was a child, I talked like a child, I thought like a child, I reasoned like a child. When I became a man, I put the ways of childhood behind me. 1 Corinthians 13:11 NIV

Ministers of the gospel often teach and demand immediate change from their church members. However, this approach contradicts the principles of growth, both natural and spiritual. When we were growing up, we all occasionally did things that weren't consistent with adult life. People were okay with it because we were children.

However, as we grow, certain behaviors are expected to naturally disappear. For example, a one-year-old child will get away with urinating on themselves because they are not able to communicate their need to go to the toilet. But by the age of five, more is expected of them. In four years, the child has been trained to use the toilet and to communicate when they need to do so. Consequently, the five-year-old has developed more mature ways of behaving and set aside some of their childish ways.

It is important to understand that both physical and spiritual growth are processes that take place over time. ***“Unlike the culture around you, always***

dragging you down to its level of immaturity, God brings the best out of you, develops well-formed maturity in you” (Romans 12:2b MSG). When you submit yourself to the ministry of the Word, it will build you up (Acts 20:32), bringing the best out of you and developing well-formed maturity in you.

In our opening Scripture, Apostle Paul, by the Spirit, was intentional about the choice of words. Note that a child talks first, then understands, and finally thinks. ***“When I was a child, I spoke as a child, I understood as a child, I thought as a child; but when I became a man, I put away childish things”*** (1 Corinthians 13:11 NKJV). However, adults think, understand, and speak; the childish pattern can only be put away when one grows up.

Look at the way of the Spirit of God: ***“Be infants in [matters of] evil [completely innocent and inexperienced], but in your minds be mature [adults].”*** (1 Corinthians 14:20b AMP). He tells us not to develop in matters of evil but to stay infants. Remain inexperienced and completely innocent. In other words, don't study and acquire knowledge of evil. Don't even keep company with corrupt people because you will end up learning from them (1 Corinthians 15:33). Grow up, begin to think as a man in Christ and set aside childish ways. Glory to God!

PRAYER

Dear Heavenly Father, I declare that I am being transformed by the renewing of my mind. I do not conform to the culture of immaturity around me. I rise to the standard of Christ. I put away childish patterns, reactions, and habits. I grow in wisdom, discipline, and spiritual understanding. In Jesus Name. Amen.

Love should always make us tell the truth. Then we will grow in every way and be more like Christ, the head. Ephesians 4:15 CEV

In my walk with the Lord, I have found that speaking the truth is most impactful when done in love. Our theme verse illustrates the essence of true spiritual growth, where everything we do is intertwined with God's love. As 1 Corinthians 13:1-3 states, no matter how much we sacrifice or exercise our spiritual gifts, our actions have no spiritual impact outside of Christ's love.

Truth should always be spoken with love, as this is the only way it can effect growth and transformation into Christ-likeness. This explains the frustration of some Christians, who, despite reading many books, praying, fasting, soul-winning, and sacrificing for the gospel, have seen little positive change in their lives. All these actions have no spiritual value when they are done without love.

Growing in love is authentic spiritual growth that supplies nourishment to the whole body. We are coordinated and connected, each person contributing something unique. The Lord wants us to

grow, not just for ourselves, but for the growth of the whole body. **“...by what every joint supplies,... by which every part does its share, causes growth of the body for the edifying of itself in love”** (Ephesians 4:16 NKJV).

The individual giving of our love gift brings perfection to every part of the body in love. This is true spiritual growth, bringing excellence, beauty, glory, and real power to our lives. **“And every member has been given divine gifts to contribute to the growth of all; and as these gifts operate effectively throughout the whole body, we are built up and made perfect in love.”** (Ephesians 4:16b TPT).

Remember, love is the perfect bond. Colossians 3:14 TPT says: **“For love is supreme and must flow through each of these virtues. Love becomes the mark of true maturity.”** True and perfect spiritual growth is only possible when love saturates our hearts, binding everything together in perfect harmony. Glory to God!

CONFESSION

Love saturates my heart. Love guides my thoughts, my words, and my actions. Love binds every virtue in me, producing true spiritual maturity. I grow in excellence, beauty, glory, and power as God’s love flows through me. I am connected, coordinated, and purposeful in His body. I am perfected in love.

GROWTH BRING INCREASED RESPONSIBILITY

By faith Moses, when he had grown up, refused to be known as the son of Pharaoh's daughter. Hebrews 11:24 NIV

The greatest responsibility of a person, nation, race, or any group of people is to discover and live out their identity. Moses, according to our opening Scripture, refused to be called the son of Pharaoh's daughter when he had grown up. This makes us understand that when he grew up, he awoke to the reality of his identity. When someone loses their identity, then they have lost everything. Identity defines who you are, where you are from, what you can and cannot do, what you worship and what you can become.

Moses began to make decisions that seemed illogical to the natural man, but he knew that he was destined to deliver the children of Israel from Egyptian bondage. He accepted the responsibility of being a deliverer. One day he went out of the palace to see what was happening to his fellow Hebrews and found an Egyptian beating a Hebrew man. He couldn't stand it so he killed the Egyptian and hid him in the sand (Exodus 2:11-12).

This incident took place after Moses had grown up! The responsibility that comes with growth moved Moses to begin doing something about the prevailing situation, although no one specifically told him what to do. Moses did not only grow physically. The Scripture shows that he matured spiritually as well; his faith moved him to take actions that were consistent with God's plan for the Hebrews.

Until this time, there is no record that the LORD spoke to Moses about delivering the Hebrews. He found out how he reached the palace, his identity, and the location of his family. He recognized that there was a purpose for his life in Egypt. Deep within his spirit, the responsibility of growth compelled him to act. The life in the palace was comfortable and prosperous, but not so for a spiritually mature man like Moses. He was not afraid of the king's wrath.

Spiritual growth instills a sense of responsibility in your spirit, compelling you to take actions that may seem illogical to the natural man, but which are perfectly aligned with divine purpose. You begin to listen to your pastor's teachings, teach others, and find joy in acting on the Word. You win souls for the Lord and bear fruits of righteousness as a result of your training. In Hebrews 12:11, we see that when you grow up, you accept certain disciplines of the Spirit, because you know that they will produce in you the character of the Spirit, yielding fruits of righteousness. Hallelujah!

CONFESSION

I declare that I know who I am in Christ and I walk in the fullness of my divine identity. I am not defined by the world, my circumstances, or the expectations of others — I am defined by God's purpose for my life. Glory to God!

IT'S TIME FOR THE NEXT LEVEL

But you, beloved, build yourselves up [founded] on your most holy faith [make progress, rise like an edifice higher and higher], praying in the Holy Spirit. Jude 1:20 AMPC

When you get born again, you confess the Lordship of Jesus Christ over your life, a total transformation and transfer takes place immediately. You become a new creation and old things pass away (2 Corinthians 5:17), but that is not all. You are transferred from the domain or dominion of darkness into the kingdom of light (Colossians 1:13 AMPC).

Our understanding of what our Lord Jesus Christ did for us is crucial. It provides the focus, direction and guidance necessary for us to live the life He gave us. Stagnation in the Christian life is never meant to happen. Our lives are a journey from glory to glory and faith to faith “....., ***are changed into the same image from glory to glory, even as by the Spirit of the Lord.***” (2 Corinthians 3:18 KJV). God has already prepared our next levels but we must grow into them, as our faith grows.

Consider a professional career. Most serious jobs don't allow someone to join at the top. They give you an opportunity to grow through the ranks by gaining experience, acquiring new knowledge, and developing new skills. If you're unwilling to learn and grow, you may as well give up on the higher level. This

principle applies to spiritual life too; you need experience with the Word and the Spirit, new knowledge, and new skill

Our opening Scripture reveals how we can ascend from one level to a higher one. Praying in the Holy Ghost builds us up. Think of a construction site in your neighborhood. Each block or brick added raises the building higher. Similarly, every sound code you utter elevates your life to a new level. This is spiritual information you have to believe and receive if you're going to progress and go to the next level as a Christian.

The other thing you need to know about getting to the next level is becoming a doer of the Word. The ministry of the Word builds you up (Acts 20:32). The Word build up in this verse is the same Greek word in Jude 20. When you receive the Word and act on it, you ascend to the next level (James 1:25 MSG). Give the Word your undivided attention and have ever increasing glory, progress and achievement. Amen.

CONFESSION

I declare that I am a new creation in Christ; the old has passed away, and all things have become new. I am delivered from the dominion of darkness and transferred into the kingdom of God's beloved Son, walking fully in His light. Many people have incorrect beliefs about God. Some see Him as a Supreme being who doesn't want to be disturbed, while others view Him as a mean and legalistic person who monitors everyone and punishes them for their wrongdoings. Some believe He doesn't exist, while others see themselves as their own god. However, others believe He is a loving, kind, and gracious Father who desires the best for His children and all creation.

When you have a clear understanding of who God is to you, nothing in this world and the world to come can ever put you at a disadvantage. In another translation, our theme verse says:

"Furthermore, we know that God causes everything to work together for the good of those who love God and are called in accordance with his purpose" (Romans 8:28 CJB).

God causes everything to work together; everything means everything except nothing. With this knowledge and understanding, you must never dwell

in the past; this is liberating to know! They are not just working together but they are working together for your good.

Whether they are good or bad things, God causes them to work together for your good.

Many Christians often side with the devil instead of God. They proclaim and announce Satan's actions rather than boldly declaring that these problems and challenges are working together for their good. Our words activate the power of our beliefs, whether positive or negative. Proverbs 18:21a states, ***“Death and life are in the power of the tongue”*** (NKJV).

Don't dwell on the past, see the Lord doing a new thing: ***“I am doing something brand new, something unheard of. Even now it sprouts and grows and matures. Don't you perceive it? I will make a way in the wilderness and open up flowing streams in the desert”*** (Isaiah 43:19 TPT). This is why your growth spiritually is important. As you receive this new information and accept it as true, you are changed from within. You start seeing on the inside of you the new things the Lord is doing. Hallelujah!

CONFESSION

I receive God's new things in my life with faith, seeing His plans sprout, grow, and mature before my eyes. I am spiritually renewed, growing in understanding, and walking confidently in the abundant life God has prepared for me. Hallelujah!

And out of the ground made the LORD God to grow every tree that is pleasant to the sight, and good for food; the tree of life also in the midst of the garden, and the tree of knowledge of good and evil. Genesis 2:9 KJV

Many people in the world today are struggling to grow their business, family, finances, career, or ministry, but do you know that growth is divine? It is part of God's plan and purpose for everything to grow. Everything created by God grows because it was created with the ability to grow and multiply.

So, why is it that not everything grows automatically? Because growth is a result of the right application of revealed means and principles. For example, as long as a seed falls to the soil and there's water, it will germinate and start growing; the power to grow is within the seed. When it comes to things like career, business, family, and ministry, most times people don't want to follow the means and principles revealed in God's Word. This is why we don't see growth as we are supposed to.

So, the first thing you need in order to experience growth in any area of your life is the understanding that God wants you to grow. It is His agenda and He wants to help you achieve it. Secondly, you must

know what His Word says about what you want to see grow. For example, if you want to grow spiritually, 1 Peter 2:2 KJV says: ***“As newborn babes, desire the sincere milk of the word, that ye may grow thereby.”*** Just like a baby feeds several times a day on their mother’s breast milk, you too must have a strong desire for the Word of God. If you do that, spiritual growth becomes inevitable.

You want promotion at your workplace, see what the Scripture says: ***“Humble yourselves [feeling very insignificant] in the presence of the Lord, and He will exalt you [He will lift you up and make your lives significant]”*** (James 4:10 AMPC). I can hear someone saying, “But what does this Scripture have to do with promotion at my workplace?”

When the Lord lifts you up and makes your life significant, nobody can ignore you. Psalms 75:6-7 TPT says: ***“This I know: the favor that brings promotion and power doesn’t come from anywhere on earth, for no one exalts a person but God, the true judge of all. He alone determines where favor rests. He anoints one for greatness and brings another down to his knees.”*** The Lord is the one who exalts, but He only exalts the humble. As for the proud, He resists them (See 1 Peter 5:5). The third requirement is to take action in accordance with the means and principles revealed to you and see exponential growth. Hallelujah!

CONFESSION

I align myself with God’s revealed principles and apply His Word faithfully. I feed daily on His Word, desiring it as a newborn desires milk, and I grow spiritually, mentally, and emotionally. Hallelujah!

Do not be so deceived and misled! Evil companionships (communion, associations) corrupt and deprave good manners and morals and character. 1 Corinthians 15:33 AMPC

God's creation is interconnected, with each element relying on others for its survival. Nothing in creation is insignificant; even seemingly useless things are essential for maintaining balance within the ecosystem. Therefore, it is wrong to destroy trees, insects, and other created things in your environment.

This is true even of the human race. No one lives alone, attends their own school, markets, grows their own food or builds their own cars without others' input or assistance. We depend on each other for our effective operation on this planet. We need to be interconnected and rely on one another. However, the Bible warns us about the quality and nature of our friendships and relationships.

For you to grow well and healthy, you must choose your company wisely. If you are a Christian, your best friends cannot be drunkards and people doing drugs; that is not a wise choice because they will corrupt your good character and morals. In fact, the Word of God teaches that continuing in that company when you want to live righteously is deceiving yourself.

Other versions say don't be fooled. This means that it is foolishness to spend most of your time with people of conflicting principles, beliefs, and pursuits.

When you choose your company or friends, you have also indirectly chosen your enemies. ***“Don't set the affections of your heart on this world or in loving the things of the world. The love of the Father and the love of the world are incompatible”*** (1 John 2:15 TPT). When you choose those who love the world and the things of the world, you have chosen God as your enemy. In which case, it would be very difficult to grow in the things of the Spirit.

Look at the warning in Psalms 1:1 ERV: ***“Great blessings belong to those who don't listen to evil advice, who don't live like sinners, and who don't join those who make fun of God.”*** Wrong company will ruin your life; there are elderly people who terribly regret the choices of friends they made when they were young. ***“Become wise by walking with the wise; hang out with fools and watch your life fall to pieces”*** (Proverbs 13:20 MSG). The wise are those who love the Lord and live according to His Word. Blessed be God!

CONFESSIO

I declare that I am part of God's creation, interconnected and purposeful. I choose my company wisely. I walk with the wise, those who love the Lord and live according to His Word. I do not set my heart on the things of this world, nor do I pursue the love of the world. I align myself with God's purposes, not the ways of sin. I refuse to be deceived by wrong counsel, foolish advice, or those who mock God. Hallelujah!



In every aspect of life, growth requires acquiring new information and internalizing it. Feeding your mind with information shapes your thinking and perspective, and releases the immense power of knowledge. Your current state stems from the information you have consumed in the past. If you are dissatisfied with your life, simply change the information you are exposed to.

Did you know that the predominant thoughts in the mind of professionals have to do with their training and practice? A market vendor thinks more about how to innovate and sell more, and those thoughts literally control that person's life.

Our opening Scripture commands us to be transformed or changed from within by changing the information that enters our mind. Do you want a change in your health or finances? It is possible. Exchange your way of thinking on the matter with God's way of thinking, and which is contained in His Word.

You know that you have written New Year resolutions for many years, but you have not been able to achieve them? You can make a change this year. Begin with internal change. Let the Lord help you. He desires to see you grow and become great. **“But be transformed (changed) by the [entire] renewal of your mind [by its new ideals and its new attitude] ...”** (Romans 12:2b AMPC). Don’t just read an isolated verse a day if you really want to achieve much this year; follow the Bible reading plan in this devotional.

You, not the Lord, can make your way prosperous, deal wisely and have good success. This is what the Bible says: **“This Book of the Law shall not depart out of your mouth, but you shall meditate on it day and night, that you may observe and do according to all that is written in it. For then you shall make your way prosperous, and then you shall deal wisely and have good success”** (Joshua 1:8 AMPC). Notice the Lord did not say the Word shall not depart from your mind but your mouth. Learn the Word and talk the Word daily. Glory to God!

CONFESSION

I choose to feed my mind with God’s Word, the highest truth and wisdom available to me. I am transformed from within by the renewal of my mind. I exchange human reasoning for God’s way of thinking. His thoughts become my thoughts. His perspective becomes my perspective. As my mind is renewed, my health improves, my finances align, and my life advances. Hallelujah!

YOU NEED A FATHER

For although you could have countless babysitters in Christ telling you what you're doing wrong, you don't have many fathers who correct you in love. But I'm a true father to you, for I became your father when I gave you the gospel and brought you into union with Jesus, the Anointed One. 1 Corinthians 4:15 TPT

The word father originates from the Greek word **pater**, which is the source of the English words pattern and patron. Fathers give life, protect, guide, and teach, much like coaches who mentor individuals to discover, develop, and reach their potential. For you to grow and do great things in a given field, you need a father in that area to develop and nurture your potential.

Spiritual Growth is not a haphazard thing you pursue; there must be clearly defined patterns you are going to follow. Through the ages, spiritual development has followed the pattern of the fathers. In Isaiah 51:1-2 the Lord wants us to remember who gave birth to us and follow the pattern already set by our fathers.

Our opening verse reminds us to look to our fathers rather than the countless instructors or babysitters for guidance. For holistic spiritual growth, follow your Pastor's teachings and be consistent in attending church services and other church-organized programs. This will steer your life in the right direction.

Listen to your Pastor's guidance. If you hear someone else or a minister contradict your Pastor, follow your Pastor's teachings until you can ask him for clarification on the subject. The great Apostle Paul told the Corinthian believers to follow him as he followed Christ. This is because he was sent by God to that congregation. ***"I want you to pattern your lives after me, just as I pattern mine after Christ"*** (1 Corinthians 11:1 TPT).

Paul was a father to the Corinthian church so he could instruct them in such a manner. There are some erroneous teachings today, that you follow Christ not a mere man, they call ministers of the gospel mere men but they are not mere men. It's humility to follow your spiritual leaders. ***"And all that you've learned from me, confirmed by the integrity of my life, deposit into faithful leaders who are competent to teach the congregations the same revelation."*** 2 Timothy 2:2 (TPT). This scripture shows you how spiritual growth can be easy if you are humble enough. Just listen and do what your Pastor is teaching and grow period

CONFESSION

I receive my Pastor's teachings with faith, consistency, and obedience. As I follow Christ through the leadership He has appointed over me, I grow in wisdom, strength, and spiritual maturity. I am planted, grounded, and flourishing. Through divine guidance and faithful mentorship, I fulfill my God-given potential.

1 Thessalonians 5:18 AMPC

The Scriptures were given to us by the inspiration of God, and they are profitable for teaching, reproof, correction, and training in righteousness, that the man of God may be thoroughly furnished for every good work (**See 2 Timothy 3:16-17**). Training or being raised in righteousness is something that you should properly understand as a Christian. Many have not been trained and raised, so they are stuck-hoping and waiting for things to happen. This is not what the Scripture teaches.

All creatures, animals, birds, insects and humans, take time to train their young. As the young ones grow, they are gradually allowed to perform certain tasks under supervision. Once fully trained, they are left to live their lives independently. This principle applies to the Kingdom as well. Once you mature, God entrusts you with the responsibility of making things happen. Glory to God!

Being grateful is one of the greatest things that you have to learn. Train yourself and your children to give

thanks regularly. Being grateful in every situation is a sign of spiritual maturity and a mark of stability. It means that nothing that happens to you moves you. You are always in charge of the situation, and not vice versa.

Our opening verse shows how we should behave in every situation, but we all know that certain situations are not easy for you to open your mouth and say that, “*Lord, I thank you for the victory that I already won in Christ.*” But when you allow the Lord Holy Spirit to culture you to do that, you will always be on top, hallelujah.

Finally, train yourself to thank the Lord Holy Ghost for every stage of growth you have attained. “It is a good thing to give thanks unto the LORD, And to sing praises unto thy name, O most High” (Psalm 92:1 KJV). Recognize His ministry and work in your life and thank Him for it. This way, you will be acknowledging His ministry in your life and learning how to walk with the Spirit. Thanking the Lord in everything is one of the catalysts of spiritual growth. It will cause you to advance at a remarkable speed. Blessed be the Lord!




